"Chad [Rabinovitz] gives me free range to select the films," she said. "He gets the bigger events, like the *Princess Bride* anniversary screening, and *Miracle*." For the others, she



makes her recommendations to festival director Mr. Rabinovitz and the festival board, who have ultimate say — but Mr. Rabinovitz asserted even last summer, "She's the one who really knows the movies."

Yet, Ms. Levandoski didn't start out in the movies at all. She studied biology, in fact, at the University of Texas, Austin — and at Indiana University in Bloomington.

Bloomington is where she caught up with Mr. Rabinovitz, who divides his time as Producing Artistic Director of both the Bloomington Playwrights Project there, and the Adirondack Theatre Festival here.

Ms. Levandoski said she got into the film world in part to have more time to raise her
