The miracle return of the missing cat, Tom

Randomly two weeks ago I encountered a woman on her way out the door at The Dockside restaurant on Glen Lake.

Her name turned out to be Carrie Dwyer, and after she left, Dockside owner Christine Mozal said Carrie had had quite a recent death-and-life experience with a cat named Tom.

I pursued the story. Carrie is an electrician for National Grid, where "I work inside the substations." She lives near the Anvil Restaurant in Fort Edward.

Her mother Mary Dwyer lives in Glens Falls, on Wing Street.

Mother and daughter are both animal lovers, rescuers. "I take in a bunch of stray animals. Financially it's really killed me," Carrie says.
