LG boat launch resisted

The state's plan to relocate the boat launch ramp at Million Dollar Beach in Lake George is drawing some fierce opposition. It proposes moving the boat launch, now on the west side of the beach, to the east side.

"This inappropriate location...is going to be a problem," said Peter Keating, a resident of Rose Point Lane just east of the beach. He said it will put motor-boats in close proximity to the neighborhood's children and others swimming.

At a Nov. 14 information session, a few of the approximately 50 people in attendance became impatient with the Department of Environmental Conservation's presentation on other aspects of the project and loudly demanded to talk about the boat launch issue.

Lake George town supervisor Dennis Dickinson appealed to let
