Mayor Diamond: \$2.5-million NYS grant is a 'gamechanger' for GF

Mayor Jack Diamond says the \$2.5-million the City is receiving from New York State toward a \$23-million mixed-use project

is a "game-changer for Glens

He said it sets the stage for a parking-retail-residential project called the Hudson Avenue Marketplace, on land that is now largely a Glens Falls Hospital parking lot between Hudson Avenue and Park Street.

"The model is in Saratoga, the new building with a parking structure, a Price Chopper and condos," the Mayor said.
