

### **SPoT Coffee finally opens in downtown GF**

SPoT Coffee, the Toronto, Canada-based chain, long in preparation/renovation at the former Godnick's Building in downtown Glens Falls, took the paper off the windows this week and set a soft opening for Wednesday, April 16. SPoT Coffee's Chelsea Heilmann told The Chronicle they'd open officially Thursday, April 17, from 6 a.m. to 11 p.m. The 2,500-square-foot café will operate seven days a week — weekdays 6 a.m. to 11 p.m., Saturdays 7 a.m. to midnight, Sundays 7 a.m. to 11 p.m The classic building, once home to the YMCA, is owned by Bruce Levinsky, Bruce Boswell and Hudson Falls contractor Mitch Havens. On the upper three floors, Mr. Levinsky said they have leased 10 of the 29 apartments at rents ranging from \$775 to \$1,895 a month, not including utilities.
