### 185 years of Lake George souvenirs!

"I have collected Lake George souvenirs over the 25 years I have been an antiques dealer," says Henry Caldwell, who oper-

ates Black Bass Antiques in Bolton Landing.

"There's a lot of history in them. I always enjoyed souvenirs" — as do many of us.

Tonight, Thursday, June 12,

at 7 p.m., Mr. Caldwell speaks about "185 Years of Lake George Souvenirs" at Crandall Public Library in Glens Falls, as part of the speaker series related to the Chapman Museum's current "At the Lake" exhibits.

He said some souvenirs he'll bring to the talk — like his Gaslight Village bumper placard, brightly colored Bolton Landing and Fort William Henry pennants and even Bavarian china pieces dating to the early 1900s — are from his shop.

"And I'm going to raid a few houses, with permission, and bring some great stuff from some private collections."

He said the oldest piece he will bring, from 1825, is an English



blue ceramic serving platter with a Lake George scene.

"I will be bringing a lot of stuff that crosses over into being a collectible," Mr. Caldwell said, including sterling silver spoons from the late 1800s depicting
