York State Association of Realtors® is warning its members not to hire drones to take photos for their

"Essentially, based on the FAA's interpretation...we are advising our members that they should not be utilizing drones in their real estate activities," said Anthony Gatto, lead counsel for the New York State Association of Realtors®.

We contacted Mr. Gatto to follow up on our July 17 story about Fred Pflaum, a retired trial attorney and licensed pilot who has started his own drone photography business on Lake George.

Mr. Pflaum cited a court decision in March where a National Transportation Safety Board Administrative Judge ruled the FAA doesn't have jurisdiction over remote control aircraft because rules governing commercial use of drones hadn't come out of a formal rule-making process.

The FAA immediately appealed
