Storied-Boards of Lake George

StoriedBoards — Tyler, Garrett and Whitney Russell's three-year-old business in Lake George — dismantles old barns and then sells the weathered wood to a growing list of residential and commercial customers.

Takes down old barns, repurposes wood, tells its heritage

"My light-bulb moment was when I was doing research into the reclaimed lumber market and discovered nobody sells the history of the lumber along with the wood," said Tyler, 32.

"What we do is source the wood, reclaim it, process it and then retail it, and we also do the research and get the documenta-

tion and pass on the history of the materials to the customer... All things being equal, people want to know where the wood they are buying came from."

He said the wood is "aged and vintage over time, and with the passage of time is a history. We

thought, why not preserve the history while preserving the lumber? Hence, StoriedBoards."
