Sally Longo sets airport restaurant

Long-time local caterer Sally Longo will manage The Aviator full-service restaurant expected to open in January at Warren County's Floyd Bennett Airport.

The lunch and dinner restaurant will be owned by Rich and Beth Schermerhorn, who operate the airport under a contract with the county.

"Rich has been a client of mine for a long time

and we always enjoyed working together," said Ms. Longo, whose Aunt Sally's Catering has been in business for 25 years.

"He asked me at a party I was catering, would I be interested in running my own restaurant?

"I had a long list of deal-breakers, I told him. But it turns out,



we were very much in sync in our thoughts.

"I want to have the kind of place where the hospitality is amazing, the food different and made from scratch, where quality is important, and I want to continue the catering as well."

The restaurant is situated immediately adjacent to the runway. Smaller planes will pass within 50 feet or closer to a bank of windows overlooking

the tarmac. The westward view is a mountain range that includes West Mountain Ski Area.

"Every seat will have a view of the runway," Ms. Longo says.

"Sally is fully in charge of running the place," said Mr. Schermerhorn. "It's her show... and her menu. I know it will be a success."

"It won't be a gigantic menu," Ms. Longo says. "I like to keep
