

Charles Evans Hughes was born in Glens Falls to a woman of exceptionally strong faith and a father who was an abolitionist preacher, a head of the anti-slavery forces in the upper Hudson River Valley. Throughout

his distinguished public career,

Hughes was a civil rights stalwart, a role for which he has not been accorded credit.

For a century and a half, America's legal system followed a shameful and inhuman path on the issue of slavery, first ignoring
