Otto severed his spinal cord in a fall while shoveling snow near the University of Maryland-Baltimore County, where he was about to start playing ice hockey. But he's cracking jokes with

friends on Facebook, and says he aims to

> walk again by his 20th birthday in July 2017. How can he be so upbeat? "It's really the fact of how many people are behind me," he said.
