Much remains unknown about moose, the largest land animal in New York State.

Moose were extirpated in New York by the 1860s, but they've been coming back on their own, moving in from surrounding areas, at least since the 1980s, says DEC's moose website,

http://bit.ly/1alJn5S. DEC biologists estimated in 2010 that there were 500 to 800 moose in New York.
