The local club was founded 91 years ago in 1925. It has approximately 85 members from the greater Glens Falls region. Funds raised at Taste of the North County are all spent locally.

The Kiwanis Community Service Budget last year was approximately \$75,000. That's raised by three major events: The annual Duck Race and Family Festival at Haviland's Cove in July, a Golf Tournament in August and Taste of the North Country.


