Rich Schermerhorn, the Queensbury developer, flew Donald Trump surrogates to rallies around the country in his private jet in the week before the historic Nov. 8 election.

And at the President-elect's victory speech Tuesday night in New York City, Mr. Schermerhorn, his wife Beth and best friend Brett West, a Queensbury native who now lives in Connecticut, had prime seats.
