In Delhi, my favorite restaurant is an Afghan place, run by a group of Afghan refugees. Sharif [not his real name] works at the restaurant every single day. After I went to the restaurant a dozen or so times, we got talking about his story.

Sharif is from rural Afghanistan. He is a Hazara, an ethnic group that looks Asian and are Shia Muslims. They were subject to much of the worst of the Taliban rule. They were massacred en masse, burned alive, tortured and so on.
