

Bald eagles — America's symbol — have made a big comeback in the Empire State. "The bald eagle population in New York has just exploded," wildlife biologist Scott Crocoll tells *The Chronicle*.

"We had gotten down to one pair in 1970, on Hemlock Lake in western New York...and they weren't a healthy pair. They weren't producing young at that point." Now? "In 2017, as of two months ago, we are up to 460
