Matt Paszko completes 'LG 12ster' solo Ultra challenge

Queensbury's Matt Paszko, 28, is thought to be the first solo hiker to complete the "Lake George 12ster Ultra Challenge"—climbing in less than 24 hours the 12 mountains around Lake George on a 41-mile hike.

The 12ster Challenge was created last August by Matthew Haley. It includes Thomas, Sleeping Beauty, Erebus, Buck and Black Mountains, plus the seven peaks in the Tongue Mountain range.

"My goal was to finish it," said Matt, a 2007 graduate of Queensbury High School and

now a sixth-grade math teacher at his alma mater.

"I wanted to see if I could do it. I wanted to push myself. I've been a hiker all of my life.

"I thought I would jog a lot of it initially, but I realized pretty quickly that I wouldn't be able to keep that pace. I averaged about three miles an hour...It was so amazing."

In less than a year, 87 people have registered with Lake George 12ster creator Matthew Haley's website, www.lakegeorge12ster.com to say they completed the 12-peak challenge.

Contacted for comment, Haley said Paszko is the first to complete the Lake George 12ster Ultra challenge alone.

Paszko started his solo journey at 6:05 a.m. on Friday, Aug. 11, climbing Cat and Thomas Mountains in Bolton in less than two hours. He videotaped his entire trip, and it's now posted on YouTube and on the Lake
