"It was the most horrifying experience of my life," 64-year-old retired nurse Rita Sweenor told *The Chronicle* Monday.

Last Wednesday, Aug. 16, she was mauled by what turned out to be a rabid coyote on the

Washington County canal path connecting Fort Edward with the Feeder Canal and its series of locks known as the Five Combines in Hudson Falls.

Mrs. Sweenor is a 1971 Lake George High School graduate
