

Our family — my wife Sandra, our sons Alexander and Max, Max's girlfriend Kira and I spent New Year's week in Cuba.

Like Sandy's and my trip to India a year ago, it was a "vacation" that defies easy description.

Cuba, as you know, is a Communist country still headed by a Castro, Fidel's brother Raoul.

Government is omnipresent. No commercial billboards are allowed. The only advertising is

government messages. I saw "iSOCIALISMO O MUERTE!" painted on a roadside

"Socialism or Death," translated Erik, our good, smart, interesting guide for the week.

Like all the guides, Erik is a government employee.

When I asked about newspapers, he said there are only two. The government owns them.

Its message is that ordinary people thrive in Cuba because of the Revolution that ousted the dictator Batista on Jan. 1, 1959.

Ninety-four percent of people own their home or apartment, and pay no property tax, we were told. Education is free, including college. But Max asked how many people actually go to college and
