I am Amanda, Joe's oldest daughter. I am honored to be given the opportunity to speak to all of you about dad and his accomplishments. Thank you to my sister Courtney and my dad's fiancée, Kathy [Porcell] for helping to create this speech.



Dad has always had a passion for the outdoors and specifically, life on camp property. He grew up in camps, since the age of 5. This life began at Camp Kenetiwa-pec Boy Scout camp along the Delaware River where he lived until 1972.

When dad was 17, a junior in high school, his family moved to Fort Ann, N.Y. after our grandfather accepted a camp ranger position at the newly purchased land where Crossett Lake Boy Scout Reservation was built.

Dad quickly fit in at his new school, as he does in every environment. If you know my dad, you probably know that his claim to fame is that he earned the title of prom king as a junior after only being in the school for 8 months!
