Her veterinary practice hits the road

A year ago — Nov. 6, 2017 — Dr. Lisa Hindson of Queensbury saw her first patient at her Hometown Mobile Veterinary Practice.

The Chronicle sat down with her — inside and outside her veterinary clinic on wheels and talked about her journey to becoming a vet, how her practice works, and advice she has for young people (women in particular) who are interested in pursuing veterinary medicine as a career.

A Queensbury native, Dr. Hindson, 47, said her route to becoming a veterinarian was a little circuitous. She earned a bachelor's degree in psychology from St. Lawrence University and that, like most vets, she al-

ways loved animals. She worked and volunteered for several years in the veterinary and animal industry to gain experience, while taking the prerequisites for veterinary school.

She notes that "after gaining experience in the field, I realized that a large part of being a veterinarian is also helping people." So, her psychology degree comes
