GF football is rolling...

The Glens Falls football team

advanced to the Class B state regional finals with a rainy, windy, 21-7 win over Beekmantown last Friday night in Clifton Park.

The 9-2 Indians
— winners of five
straight games and
three straight Section II champion-

ships — play Marlboro (10-1) of Section IX **on Saturday, Nov. 17, at 3 p.m.** at Middletown High School's Faller Field.

Marlboro beat previously unbeaten Ardsley, 27-19, to reach the regional finals.

The Indians won the school's first state title in 2016, and lost last year in the semifinals, 20-7, to Pleasantville. They have reached the state semifinals three straight years.

Saturday's game will not be telecast, but it will be live-

streamed online at www. nfhsnetwork.com, with a \$9.99 monthly subscription.

At stake is a berth in the Class B state championship game at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse **Saturday, Nov. 24, at noon** against either 2017 Class C 11-0 champion Skaneateles (Section III), or 11-0 Batavia (Section V).

Coach Pat Lilac's Indians have lost only two games, both to Class A schools. They fell to

Queensbury, 48-34, Sept. 22, and to Burnt Hills, 55-27, Oct. 6.

Burnt Hills plays in the 'A' state semifinals Friday night against Cornwall.

Since that loss to Burnt Hills, the Indians have rolled, outscoring their opponents, 157-13, in four playoff games.

Key players like two-way captain Kyle Vachon have gotten healthy, and the offense, led by
