

Total redo of a Glens Falls classic

"When I was in college, I heard that more millionaires are made in real estate than any other line of work," says 34-year-old South Glens Falls native Chris Patten. "One of my instructors, J. Buckley Bryan, Jr., said it, and it inspired me." The college



was Adirondack Community, now SUNY Adirondack, and Mr.

Patten took Mr. Bryan's advice to heart. He has been buying, building, rehabbing and learning ever

since.

His current, most visible project is the complete gutting and redo of 274 Glen, the more than a century old, long mostly unused, former hotel building at the corner of Glen and South

He bought it in March for \$390,000. Adirondack Trust is financing the project, he said.

By late spring or early summer, Mr. Patten aims to offer 18 apartments on the top two floors and a restaurant and four commercial rentals on the first floor.

Craft on 9, the Moreau eatery, will move into the completely redone former Mikado space (see sidebar), and Mr. Patten said two of the four planned commercial spaces are also spoken for.
