Governor Andrew Cuomo plans legislation to ban police release of mug shots and arrest information as an "unwanted invasion of personal privacy," the Albany Times-Union Brendan Lyons reports.

The Jan. 18 story quoted a Cuomo spokesman as saying the proposed amendment to Freedom of Information law is meant to combat websites that post arrest information and photos online and then try to have those arrested pay them to have the information removed.

We asked local sheriffs' views. Washington County Sheriff Jeff Murphy said the proposal "just seems to be in line with a lot of other things the Governor has proposed that seem to benefit criminals and felons."

"We fully understand someone charged with a crime is inno-
