
Thanks from actor who played Garrow; 'I enjoy your smart weekly paper'


Bud Gates wrote (tongue in cheek, to his friends): Joe

Girard broke the long-standing scoring record the other night, scoring 69 points. He's averaging 49 points per game.....shattered all of Jimmer's records at GF....going to Syracuse. If you read the article.....broke the record of 67 set by Rich Campoli of St. Joseph of Albany in 1964.

St Joseph LOST that game to some pissant school in the toolies called Bolton Landing. What a game it was! Cobber Pratt and I both went off for about 30 points...Gary Ryder chipped in another 20...and we won 98 to 95. We had played a zone all game, it was all we knew. With about 20 seconds to go and the game tied I huddled the team on the floor and said....let's go man to man. I took Campoli and stopped him. Thus....it was my defensive gem that kept Campoli from scoring 69 that night. Girard....you owe me! Otherwise, you only just TIED the record!
