The 15th annual Lake George Area Boat Dealers in-water boat show takes place at the Lake George Village municipal docks

and Beach Road on Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 14 and 15, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is free.

"There's quite a variety of boats...a

little bit of everything," in the water and on the land, from a 30foot pontoon boat with a 425-hp engine to bowriders, ski boats, wake-surf boats and more, said Roger Phinney, one of the event organizers.

The Boat Dealers website touts "closeout pricing on 2019 and select pre-owned models," and demos of new 2020 models.

Mr. Phinney said leftover 2019s and recent-year used boats with good pricing "get snapped up as soon as they're available."

He said the show features both high-end models and moderatelypriced boats "much more affordable for average family income."

Mr. Phinney said some boat manufacturers, as in other industries, have had a hard time finding enough employees, resulting
