the former Tallulah's restaurant on Ridge Street in Glens Falls. They plan to open Radici Kitchen & Bar, "hopefully in early January or at least mid-January."

Radici means "roots" in Italian, Ms. Mankouski explained.

"It's about circling back to our roots, what

we love most, about our passion for this industry," said Mr.



"It's about us putting down roots for the first time together," said Ms. Mankouski.

Radici will seat 50 and serve an "Italian-modern" but "wideranging" menu.

They said they'll also have 14 taps including a dozen craft beers; and full wine, liquor service and craft cocktails, once they obtain their liquor license.

They plan to operate six days a week, closed Mondays, with

Sunday brunch and maybe a classic Italian-style Sunday din-

"We have so many ideas," the couple said.

They met about 10 years ago at the Ginger Man Restaurant in Albany, where Mr. Bowden was in the kitchen and Ms. Mankouski was front of house.
