

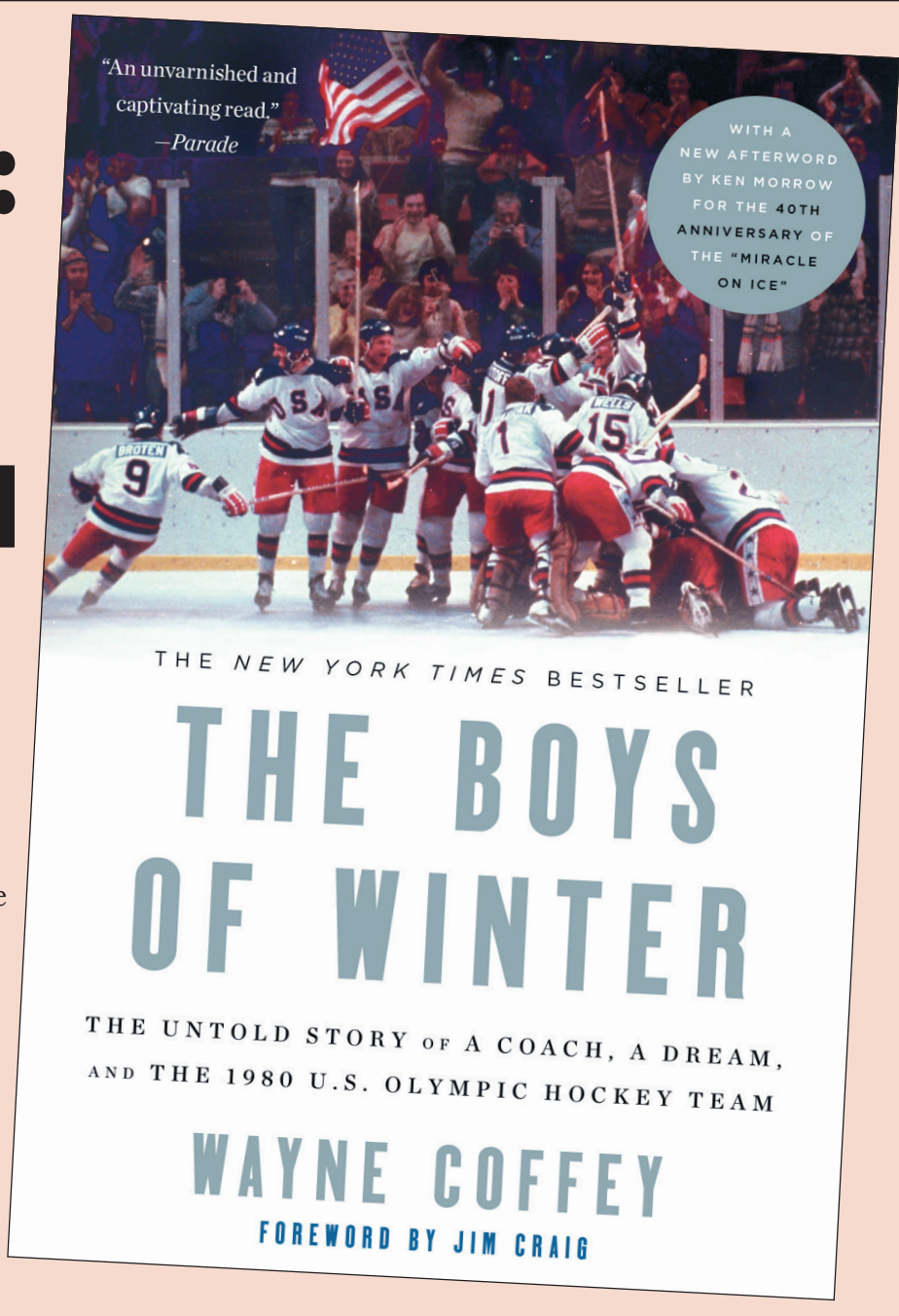
It was 40 years ago: U.S. beat Soviets in Lake Placid Olympics
