# Outdoor graduations a go

**Chronicle Managing Editor Queensbury High School** plans to conduct outdoor graduation ceremonies on the football field in eight small groups now that Governor Cuomo authorizes it starting Friday, June 26.

Queensbury's 293 graduates will receive their diplomas in eight separate full ceremo**nies** over two days — Friday and Saturday, June 26 & 27 — each for approximately 37 students, with two guests each. Attendance is limited to 150 people at a time.

Rain date is Sunday, June 28. They're still figuring whether they will use a tent.

Speakers will repeat their speeches at all eight ceremonies. Make that nine, as the school already prepared a virtual ceremony through the company Vego, in case the in-person option didn't materialize.

"Everyone is so elated," Superintendent Kyle Gannon told The Chronicle Monday night after the school board's okay. "These kids really deserve this. They really wanted to be together for graduation. There has been a lot of sadness at some of their meetings."

South Glens Falls High **School** "will be holding a full commencement ceremony at the Glen Drive-In" on Thursday, June 25, starting at 8:30 p.m., said the school's Monica Lester. "This ceremony will be live-Please turn to page 7
