150 boats in Trump parade on Lake George

Chronicle editor Mark Frost writes: Dave Wick, executive director of the Lake George Park Commission, estimates that 150 boats participated in Sunday's Lake George parade in support of President Donald Trump.

Mr. Wick said there was "no illegal activity that culminated from that event. People were under the speed limit" and "far

enough away from shore" where a 5 mile an hour limit applies.

But he said participating boats were "going anywhere between 15 and 20 miles an hour. Most of the boats tended to be cruisers; they throw off a pretty good wake." He likened that many boats together to an "armada."

Warren County Sheriff Jim La-Farr had no comment, nor did the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

The Chronicle's understanding is that a public dock at Long Island campsite 13 was washed off its fasteners by the waves and has been repaired, and that a boat docked there was damaged and the campers received "minor injuries." The camper posted
