Anecdotally I'm hearing from everybody, "We can't find help."


Liza Ochsendorf, Warren County's Director of Employment and Training, can speak more authoritatively.


GF taps woman owned **ENVI-SION** to design South Street Marketplace

Chronicle Managing Editor New York State has legalized marijuana. Now what, hemp growers?

"We are in regulatory limbo," says Seth Jacobs at Slack Hollow Farm in Argyle. "The new marijuana bill is also a hemp bill."

Slack Hollow was one of about a dozen Washington County Farms granted license starting in 2018 to grow hemp — cannabis plants lacking THC, which has medical applications but also produces the psychoactive reactions associated with "pot."
