"A lot of people talk about wanting to have an impact on climate change, and there are campaigns calling for broad national or global initiatives."

But, on a small but real scale, contends Bill Richmond, "Diverting your food waste from the trash stream and creating compost that helps retain moisture and carbon in the soil is the most impactful thing individuals can do."

In the past 18 months, Mr. Richmond says his **Adirondack** Worm Farm in Hudson Falls has collected 5 tons of food waste from area residents and the cafeteria at St. Mary's-St. Alphonsus Regional Catholic School.

"Our service takes food waste that can't be composted in backyards, including meat and dairy,
