Although the exact origin of the name is unknown, there is mention of a disastrous fire there in the late nineteenth century.

The island may have gotten its name, however, from even earlier fires. In the days before



Native Americans used to burn off old fields and forest edges for new crops. However, this slash-and-burn technique often resulted in forest fires which would burn out of control over huge areas. Perhaps the original inhabitants viewed Big Burnt Island as an ideal place to

employ this technique, as they could be certain that the fire would not spread beyond the bounds of the island.
