Mr. Traina told *The Chronicle* he did not wish to comment at this time.

The action comes after Governor Kathy Hochul announced an emergency regulation Sept. 2

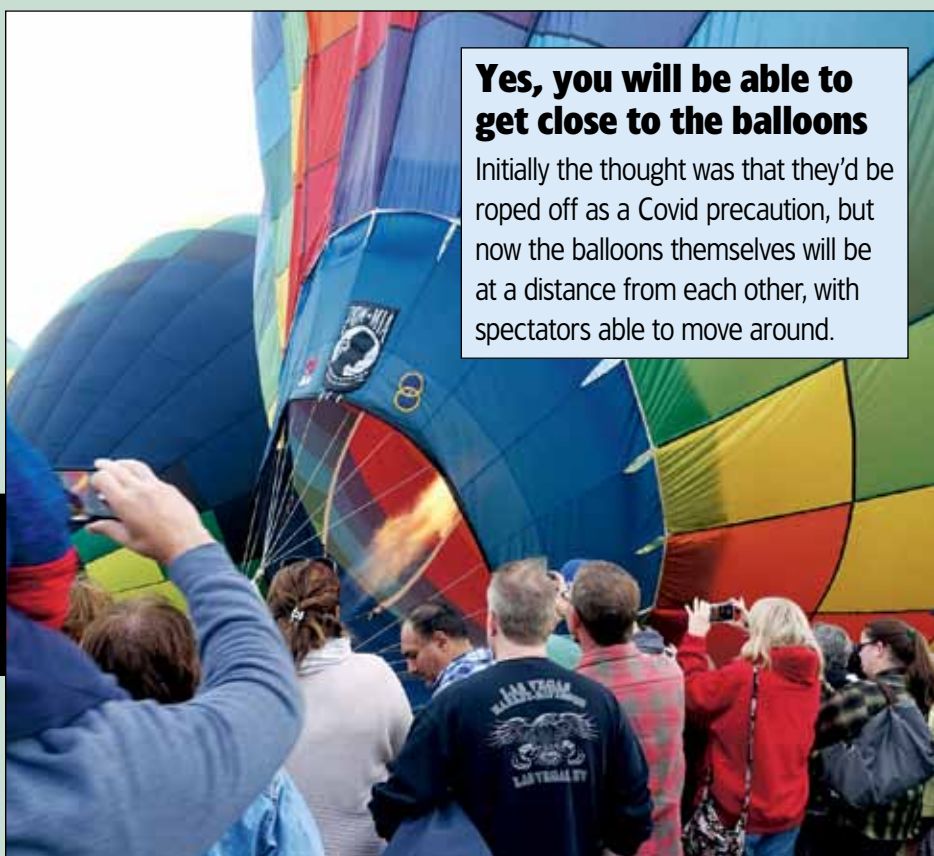
## Mass launches at airport only: Friday afternoon; Sat.-Sun., a.m.; crowds can approach

# Adk. Balloon Fest! It's back! Special shapes, Covid changes

Here's the latest on the Adirondack Balloon Festival, which opens today, Thursday, Sept. 23.

There will be three mass balloon launches, all at Warren County's Floyd Bennett Memorial Airport — on Friday evening, Saturday morning and Sunday morning, says festival director Mark Donahue.

Just under 50 hot air balloons, compared to the typical 100, are expected.

"Realize, most balloon festivals have just cancelled," Mr. Donahue notes.

Where they had thought that spectators would be roped away from the balloon launches — a first for this event — Mr. Donahue said people will be able to get up close to the balloons, as always.

The balloonists will be assigned specific sites on the field, spaced far apart to maintain social distancing.

On Thursday, there's no Crandall Park balloon launch but downtown will host its Glens Falls Balloon Party, with car show, live music, "candlestick" propane flares in balloon baskets and children's activities.

There's no Saturday afternoon launch at the airport, but there will be static balloon displays in the early evening and an after-dark Moon Glow.

The festival will feature four special shape balloons: The Dragon, Panda Bear, Fred the Rabbit, and Sunny Boy.

### Essential workers in 40 balloons

The 2021 Festival theme is "Celebrating Our Local Essential Workers."

For the Saturday morning launch, the plan is for every balloon to have a local essential worker aboard. They've contacted area health providers, County Health De-

partments and others to offer the rides. "Our pin this year has the rainbow theme, for essential workers also," said Mr. Donahue.

Sunday morning's launch is renamed "Walter and Joanie's Mass Ascension" a simultaneous liftoff of all balloons. It will honor festival founder Walt Griskot, who died in 2011, and his wife, Joanie, who kept the festival together. She died earlier this summer.

Mr. Donahue said he's reserving a full tribute to Mrs. Griskot for next year's festival, "when we will be all the way back."

### No commercial rides allowed

Balloonists will not be permitted to offer commercial rides for paying passengers.

"They won't get any income, with no paid rides, but they still wanted to come. That spoke volumes to me," Mr. Donahue said.

"We do try to take good care of them," he said, noting that many probably didn't fly for most of the prior 18 months, grounded by Covid.

Pilots are required to be vaccinated, Mr. Donahue said. Spectators are asked to wear masks if they are not vaccinated.

"I would hope as pilots they would want

to be role models, and also, they are taking essential workers up with them."

All flights are weather permitting, as always.

There will be no food, craft vendors or activities at the airport between launches, Mr. Donahue said. That includes no balloon festival merchandise, "We couldn't say no to everyone, and not us too," he said.

Festival T-shirts, sweatshirts and pins will be available during tonight's Downtown Glens Falls street party on Thursday.

Drive-through merchandise sales will continue — so long as supplies last — in the CWI parking lot on Quaker Road, next to Binley's Garden Center, on Saturday and Sunday mornings from 7-11 a.m. and Saturday afternoon from 3 to 7 p.m.

This is the 48th Adirondack Balloon Festival but not its 48th year, because Covid caused its cancellation last year.

"We're just forgetting that one," Mr. Donahue said.

Other notes: The usual Crandall Park launches on Thursday and Sunday afternoon both will not take place, due to crowd control concerns, Mr. Donahue said.

### Cathy's Balloon tips!

**Chronicle Managing Editor Cathy DeDe offers:** A few tips to enjoy the balloon festival, most the same as any year.

- Remember, all balloon flights are weather dependent. Please be patient.
- Dress for the weather. Early morning launches can be cold, and wet.
- No pets. No drones.
- Get there early to avoid lines into the airport.
- With no food or other vendors, plan to bring your own picnic and seating or blanket.
- Bring a flashlight if attending the Moonglow. It gets dark.
- Ask if you can to help with the balloon. Do what the pilot and crew ask.
- Especially this year, if you plan to follow a balloon, remember that private landowners may be concerned about social distancing.

Volunteers are still needed to help crew especially the large special shape balloons, organizer Mark Donahue says. Families or individuals interested in helping can meet outside the terminal building prior to the balloon launches.

### No Balloon Fest breakfast; Open Door must adjust

The Adirondack Balloon Festival returns this year, but not the Big Balloon Breakfast in the Warren County Airport hangar Saturday & Sunday mornings.

Open Door Mission food kitchen and shelter typically nets about \$30,000 from the event, President and CEO Kim Cook tells *The Chronicle*.

"Losing it two years in a row is not easy," Ms. Cook said. "But we were mentally prepared not to have it again. We're just looking for other ways to make it up so we can keep serving those in need in our community."

**New** this year: Open Door Mission will do the "Glens Falls Gobble Wobble," a 5K fund-raising run and walk on Thanksgiving Day, Nov. 25. Details: [glensfallsgobblewobble.com](http://glensfallsgobblewobble.com).

Ms. Cook said it's similar to the Thanksgiving day James P. Hinchliffe Run/Walk for A.L.S. that was discontinued in 2020. "We are grateful to be picking up the baton for this community event, and we hope to run with it for years to come," she said.

Overall, Ms. Cook says, "We're doing okay. Early on in the pandemic, donations for many non-profits went up. This summer, as people could start traveling again, donations went down some. Normally, the Big Balloon Breakfast would be a much needed infusion of cash. We won't have that again this year so we're hoping donations will pick up soon."

### Balloon Fest happy with its funds raised

Adirondack Balloon Festival organizer Mark Donahue says they've raised about 60 percent less money than in prior years. "That's better than we thought it would be," he said.

Professional fund-raisers Barb and Kerry Schrader "really stepped up," volunteering to run the effort. This year, the festival debuted a new schedule of funding levels from \$90 to \$5,000, rather than asking supporters to sponsor specific balloons, as in the past.

## Albany Biz Review: Warren County hotel revenue \$98.2-million for June-July-August

"Hotel revenue across Warren County totaled \$98.2 million for June, July and August, a 57% increase compared with the summer of 2020, according to new data from hospitality industry tracker STR," reported Robin K. Cooper in the Albany Business Review on Monday, Sept. 20.

"Hotel occupancy in Warren County jumped from 55% in July 2020 to 74% in July 2021. In August, occupancy increased to nearly 79% with many hotels filling up for much of the month."

Mr. Cooper interviewed Fort William Henry president Sam Luciano, who said that last summer, 70% of the resort's guests were first-time visitors, most from within 60 miles of New York City.

Mr. Cooper writes: "Half of those guests returned this summer, Luciano said. And more regulars from previous years returned."

Gina Mintzer, executive director of the Lake George Chamber of Commerce and Convention and Visitors Bureau, was quoted: "When you factor in that no one had enough staff, it was a great summer. Last year, you had restaurants with empty tables because of [pandemic] restrictions. This summer you had empty tables because restaurants didn't have enough staff."

# WorkSmart open house for repurposed TD First National Bank building

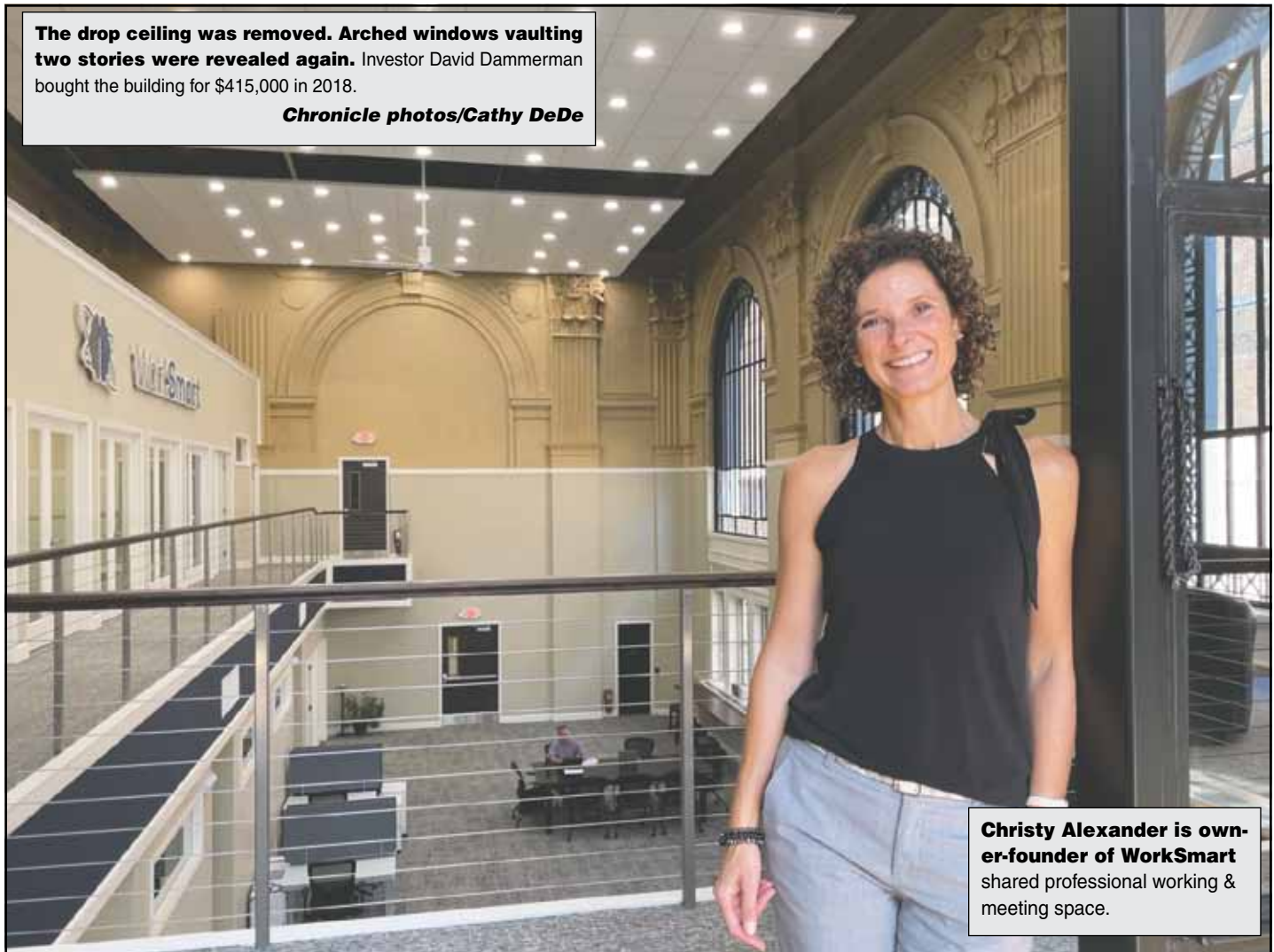

WorkSmart occupies approximately 6,000 square feet in the marble clad former bank building that dates from 1914.

Ms. Alexander said she worked closely with building owner David Dammerman to reveal architectural elements such as decorative arches and oversized arched windows hidden for decades.

They added a mezzanine to accommodate private offices.

"The building has history and there are

scars. It's okay to see that because it's part of the building's story," Ms. Alexander said.

WorkSmart occupies the front part of the building, the original bank. The modern three-story addition at the back of the building is still available to rent.

WorkSmart initially opened on Warren Street in Civic Center Plaza. Ms. Alexander says it was "a good MVP" — "minimum viable product" — "a starting place to launch the business and introduce the concept of shared office space in this area."

It's membership-based, "like a gym," Ms.

Alexander said. Memberships range from \$159 a month to use shared spaces, to \$409 a month for a private office and 24/7 access. Drop-in passes cost \$25 a day.

Fees include "all the amenities," she said, such as WiFi.

"It's not just a desk and a chair," Ms. Alexander says. "It's a membership community. I'm making sure professionals have what they need to succeed, connections, resources, tools, and collaborations with others in the community."

She offers gatherings like a "Breakfast

of Champions" goal setting event, as Covid allows. "We get to be part of watching each others businesses grow."

She said she has space for more than 20 offices, with "a couple left to fill."

"A lot of the marketing is educating the community on the space and what we're here for. People who come from New Jersey or New York City, come looking for us because they are used to it. The way people work is being reimaged. We want to be a part of that, to bring that to Glens Falls."

## Owner David Dammerman's renovations tale

"The First National Bank building is an iconic feature of downtown Glens Falls," says David Dammerman, who bought the white marble-clad Roman Revival-style former bank building in 2018. It dates from 1915.

"In giving the building new life, it was important to honor its history," he told *The Chronicle*.

As renovations began, he said, "One look above the ceiling revealed yet another ceiling. And beyond that were inspiring architectural details — beautiful cast stone work and the grand arched windows that had been covered since 1969.

"Some of the damage done in earlier renovations was more than a little disheartening. As we dug further, we uncovered the opportunity to reimagine the boardroom overlooking Glen Street.

"Above its drop ceiling were a vaulted

ceiling that the construction crew was confident it could restore, and more windows to uncover.

"No part of the renovation was easy.

"With every step came decisions about how far to go with restoration and puzzles about how the new construction would mesh with the old.

"Where we found conditions that would be extremely difficult to change — like the old cash vault — we chose to highlight it as a feature of the space.

"Reimagining the lobby for WorkSmart's combination of private offices and open spaces required some creative solutions from the construction team. We couldn't be happier with the result.

"The building is a natural fit for WorkSmart," Mr. Dammerman says, "where clients can give their businesses a very professional location and enjoy all that downtown Glens Falls has to offer."

Beyond WorkSmart, "there will be an **additional 15,000 square feet available** in the remainder of the building," Mr. Dammerman said. — **Cathy DeDe**

### About David Dammerman

In a 2013 story in the *Saratogian*, David Dammerman was described as chief executive officer of Great Mountain Investment Associates. A 1991 graduate of Hamilton College, he is the son of the late Dennis Dammerman, who was Chief Financial Officer for General Electric and later served as vice chairman of GE's Board of Directors.

Mr. Dammerman, 52, is also a marathon swimmer. He swam the 32-mile length of Lake George in 2016 in less than 19 hours, which was thought to be a record time, according to a *Chronicle* story at the time.

He was said to hold the record for the "Search for Memphre" 25-mile swim on Lake Memphremagog in Vermont.

### He bought the building for \$415,000 in 2018

TD Bank closed its branch at 237 Glen Street on Jan. 29, 2016.

The 1915 building was originally the headquarters of First National Bank of Glens Falls, which became Evergreen Bank and was eventually absorbed into Toronto Dominion Bank of Canada.

Though the building was assessed at \$1.766-million, with annual taxes of \$59,620.88, it was first listed for sale for \$625,000.

David Dammerman of Saratoga Springs bought it for \$415,000 on Nov. 16, 2018.

# Warren County Senior Meals progress: Sysco food purveyor; seek more paid staff, volunteers

Warren County's "Meals on Wheels" senior citizen food delivery and meal site program took a positive turn at Friday's Board of Supervisors meeting.

County Administrator Ryan Moore reported that one element which had threatened services has been resolved.

Earlier this summer, the County had lost its food purveyor, cutting the supply chain for local meal preparation, prompting the Board to propose sourcing frozen meals from a company called Mom's Meals.

However, Mr. Moore reported Friday: The county has secured a "breakthrough" contract with SYSCO, "a major food contractor for the state," allowing the meal sites and preparations "to operate as normal."

The county originally proposed an \$800,000 deal for Mom's Meals to be "the only source for most if not all of the senior citizens' meals," he said.

Now, Mr. Moore said he envisions Mom's Meals as "an emergency backstop option" only, on a contract "not to exceed \$85,000." "We don't foresee anywhere near the level

of usage we originally thought," Mr. Moore reported. "\$85,000 is a worst case scenario."

He said the county is also committed to continue in-person delivery and visitation to home-bound seniors who receive the meals "at least three times a week."

Three days has been the delivery arrangement since 2020, Don Lehman, Warren County Director of Public Affairs, tells *The Chronicle*.

"The hope is to return to five days a week if we can recruit enough new workers."

As to any other changes, Mr. Moore said, "The local Supervisors" of the impacted towns "would have to agree. They are the ones who know their seniors and their community the best."

Mr. Lehman said that because of staffing issues, Mom's Meals is currently being used in Chester and Warrensburg. "The goal is to fill open jobs and get the program back to normal."

### Looking to fill six job openings

Mr. Lehman said, "Right now there are six meal site staff openings, one each in Lake Luzerne, Chester, the Cedars in Queensbury, and Indian Lake, and two in Warrensburg. These jobs have to be filled to get these sites functioning at full speed."

"We have begun an advertising campaign hoping to recruit more workers which hadn't been done before, so we are optimistic we can get the word out and find some folks willing to help."

"On Monday our Office for the Aging and Civil Service office heard from 5 interested people...which is a good start."

"More volunteers are always needed to deliver meals," he adds.

Meals on Wheels volunteer drivers **Arthur Yannotti, Gene Casella and Edith Monroe** addressed the Board Friday.

Each asserted the value of the program not just to provide food to senior citizens but for the social, emotional and sometimes even physical support that comes with the personal contact.

"We're talking about loneliness here,"

Mr. Casella said, visibly fighting tears. "Whatever we can do to resolve this program we must do. You don't know what's

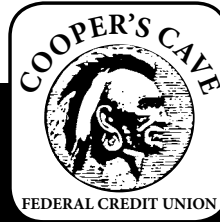
going on with these homebound seniors... The loneliness is incredible."

## Warren County's meal sites & their vacancies as of now

Here are the Warren County meal sites and their status as of Friday, as provided by Don Lehman, Warren County Director of Public Affairs.

- **The Chester and Warrensburg** sites are not staffed due to vacancies and are not offering congregate sites for in-person meals. **Both are currently being serviced by Mom's Meals.**

- **Bolton:** Fully staffed; cooking 5 days/week, congregate site open 2 days

- **The Cedars, Queensbury:** Mostly staffed; cooking 5 days/week, congregate site not open

- **Johnsburg:** Fully staffed; cooking 5 days/week, congregate site open 2 days

- **Lake Luzerne:** No staff due to vacancy, but covered by substitutes; cooking 3 days/week, congregate site open 2 days

- **First Presbyterian Church** in Glens Falls and **Solomon Heights** in Queensbury: Cedars staff covers both sites but don't cook here; congregate sites not open

**Warren County also services** these sites in Hamilton County:

- **Indian Lake:** Partially staffed due to vacancy, covered by subs; cooking 5 days/week, congregate site open 2 days

- **Lake Pleasant:** Shares staff with Wells; congregate site open 1 day/week

- **Long Lake:** No staff due to vacancy, covered by subs; cooking 5 days/week, congregate site open 2 days/week

- **Wells:** Fully staffed; cooking 5 days/week, congregate site open 2 days

# Her LG Jazz reflections

**Editor's note:** Emma Green is a graduate of Glens Falls High School and Yale University, and has been enjoying the Lake George Jazz Weekend since childhood, she notes. She offered this response to the event, as presented by the Lake George Arts Project on Sept. 17-19.

On Saturday afternoon a rain shower blew over Shepard Park, peppering the gathered crowds. Some fled the weather but many others raised their umbrellas and hunkered down, heads bobbing to the music, anchored to their folding chairs by the insistent rhythms of Little Big, one of the bands in Saturday's lineup for the Lake George Jazz Weekend.

Jazz at the Lake returned last weekend after a 2020 hiatus, and Little Big was a highlight, with the driving chords of pianist Aaron Parks' compositions energizing both the audience and the performances of an exquisite quartet that drew on rock, as well as jazz, influences.

Other innovations included the Dayna Stephens Quartet's set: Stephens' subtle playing on saxophone and an electronic woodwind instrument evoked both the breathy sensitivity of traditional woodwinds and the electronic stylings of synth.

On Sunday Ingrid Jensen performed more manual effects, blowing through her trumpet to create pigeon-like coos and rustles, then layered them using a looping pedal. Her curiosity for the instrument's possibilities contributed to compositions like "Speech Bubbles," in which murmurs and burbles from her trumpet provided a looped foundation for her masterful playing.

On Friday, Daniel Kelly tried his own innovation — a multimedia presentation in which photos by the Seeing With Photography Collective were projected while Kelly's trio played music he'd composed in response to the images.

While the images thrummed with energy, the music's subdued motions didn't match that intensity, and Kelly's commentary mainly focused on the project as an opportunity for artists with visual impairments to 'participate in the sighted world' — in doing so, missing an opportunity to dive into the contents of the photos on their own rich terms.

Kelly's skills as a curator, however, were on full display: The weekend offered a lineup of exceptional musicians, many reveling in the energy of a live audience after too long playing to virtual crowds.

The gratitude was mutual — after a year of few opportunities for live music it was a gift to hear these musicians' offerings, get out of our own heads, and tap into a common rhythm.

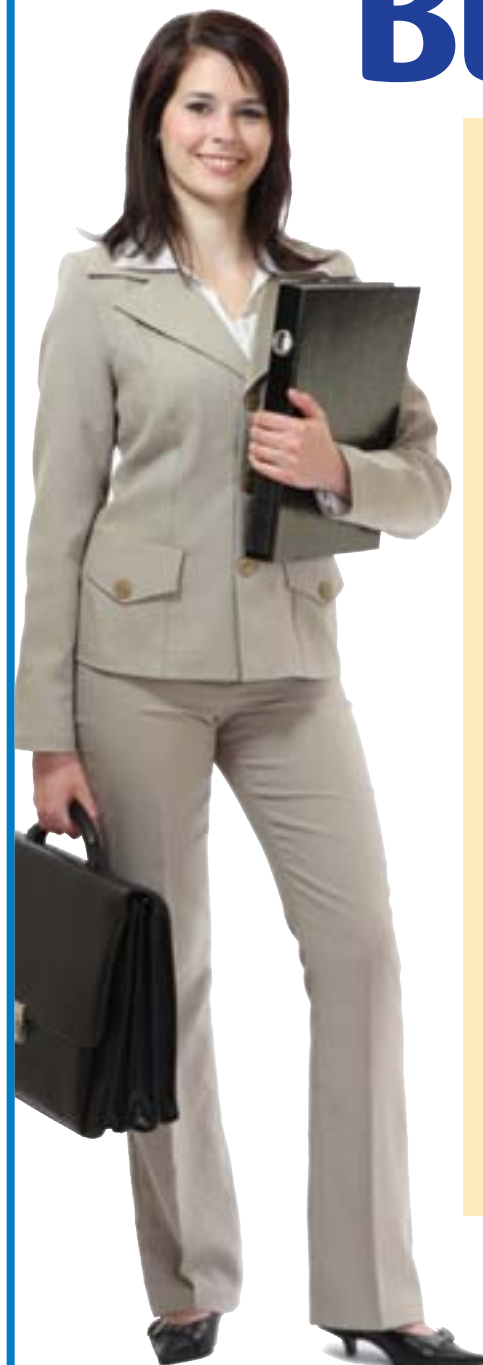

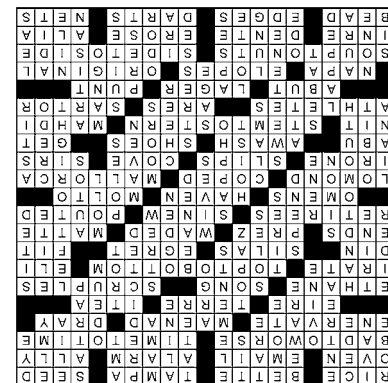

## At GF Country Club: 3 holes in 1 in 1 day

June 8, 2021 was a perfect golf day at the Glens Falls Country Club. Sunny with the temperature reaching 80 degrees.

The course was in impeccable condition with perfect fast greens and lush fairways, thanks to the quality care of long time Greens Keeper Chris Frielinghaus.

Before the day was over a very rare event took place with three holes in one being recorded on that day.

1. At 8:30 **Stu Ginsburg** aced the third hole of 110 yards with a 9-iron.

2. At 2:00 pm 85 year old **Bob Huntz** aced the 12th hole of 184 yards with a hybrid.

3. At 4:00 pm **Joe Richardson** aced the 3rd hole of 142 yards using an 8-iron.

Tom Haggerty, Glens Falls County Club's Pro for 40 years, said he has never seen or heard of a day where three holes in one were scored on the same day on the same course. He further stated there are usually three to 15 holes-in-one scored at Glens Falls C.C. each year.

The odds of an average golfer scoring a hole in one according to the United States Golf Association (USGA) is 1-12,500.

With a golf season here in the north country lasting 210 days it would average about 84 years for three hole-in-ones to be scored on the same course on the same day.

So, the fact that Pro Tom Haggerty has not seen this happen in his 40 years at the Glens Falls Country Club is supported by the odds. Perhaps if Tom spends another 40 years as the Glens Falls Golf Pro, he will see it again. Or perhaps it could happen again tomorrow.

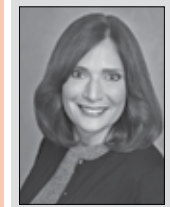

cases eradicated by virtue of immunizations. Then read about how many people died of these diseases prior to there being vaccinations for them.

"requiring all teachers, administrators and other school employees to submit to weekly COVID-19 testing unless they show proof of vaccination."

Kassie Kennison: "I fully support Joe Traina and his decision to not get the vaccine. **This mandate is violating Americans freedom to CHOOSE.** My prayers go out to him and his family. **Thank you Joe, for standing up for what you believe in.** #mybodymychoice remember?"

Shawn Stimpson: "Joe Traina Was my favorite teacher in elementary school. **I stand by his decision**"

Comments below were made on the *Post Star's* Facebook post about Mr. Traina.

Deb Kosek DiGrado: "**As a teacher, he should be FIRED!** When he sees his pen-



sion cancelled, he will get the shot!"

Mary Hall: "**Stay away from my grandchild...**"

Marie Bell: Seriously, I did not expect this from him. **He is a great teacher, there has to be something else to this story...** All the teacher, nurse or chef, etc... has to do at this point, is go get tested if they do not want to get the vaccine.
