Warren **County bans sale** & use of fireworks

At its final Board meeting of the year on December 17, Warren County's Supervisors voted to repeal the 2016 law allowing sale and personal use of socalled "sparking devices."

At a public hearing prior to the meeting, one purveyor of the devices — typically sold from tents in the weeks prior to the Fourth of July — said, "People will just go to other counties" to buy and then use them illegally.

But Gary Thornquist, General Manager of the Lake George RV Park, said the fireworks amount to "cruelty to animals," for the Please turn to page 10


