After a three-year rebuild still in progress, 220 Glen Street — the former Achenbach Jewelry store — emerged last week transformed as a landmark presence decked out with a mahogany doorway, gas flame outdoor light fixtures, copper front and a classic up-lit, down-lit facade of cleansed brick, stone,

Cool Insuring Arena completing luxury box suites

Five new luxury boxes and suites at Cool Insuring Arena are "nearly ready to go," says General Manager Jeff Mead.

He gave *The Chronicle* a quick tour Tuesday morning, while also monitoring fallout from Monday night's storm, which revealed several leaks in the re-roofing project that is currently underway.

The new suites are located next to the press box, above sections X, W and V, accessible from the Church Street entrance.

A season-long rental is priced at "northwards of \$10,000" and about \$500 to \$1,000 per event, depending on the suite size, said Mr. Mead, adding that they're still determining final numbers.

Developer Richard Schermerhorn has already rented one of the boxes, said Mr. Mead. On others, "we are in talks."

They expect corporations will rent four of the boxes for the "full package" — the whole ECHL hockey season, or potentially for all events, including concerts and sports. Final cost to be determined.

Two of the boxes they aim to hold out to offer on an event by event basis.

"It's pretty sweet," touts Mr. Mead. "Each seats 10 to 20 patrons, depending on size. Each will offer a private server and upgraded food and beverage menu, plus comfortable seating, TVs and Internet access, granite countertops, motion sensor lighting, and their own arena entrance, among other amenities."

With the one previously built box from 2018 — located on the far side of the press box, above section B — the arena will have six total boxes to rent.

Mr. Mead said, "Every arena everywhere has a private area of suites and boxes. In 2018 we started talking about putting them in, and we were ready to go, then Covid. After this year, we said it's time to build these suites."

As for construction, Mr. Mead said, "We are not yet giving out the cost" it is taking to complete the boxes, but he deemed it "a significant investment." Funding is coming "internally," he said.

Battle over use of herbicide vs. milfoil on LG

The proposed introduction of ProcellaCOR EC, an herbicide to treat the Eurasian Watermilfoil invasive species on Lake George, has split organizations around the lake.

Glen Lake already uses the chemical and says it is safe and effective. The Lake George Association is strongly opposed to its use in Lake George.

Last week, the Adirondack Park Agency twice voted 6-4 to allow the Lake George Park Commission to begin testing the chemical in Blair's Bay in Hague and Sheep Meadow Bay near Huletts Landing, Adirondack Explorer reported.

The NYS Department of Environmental Conservation has okayed its use too.

Now it awaits expected approval from the Park Commission Board.

Joe Thouin, LGPC Environmental Analyst, believes Procella-COR EC is safe. "As the New York State agency charged with protecting the water quality of Lake George and its resources, if it didn't have strong safety product profile, it would be a non starter," he told The Chronicle.

"If there was any concern for drinking water, that's obviously a non starter."

LGA: Far too many unknowns

But the LGA urged its members to write letters opposing the chemical's use.

The LGA said, in part, it could have "negative impacts to human health," that there's a lack of data regarding its interaction with organisms on Lake George, and that the chemical could spread further than just the proposed testing sites.

One APA board member who voted against the chemical's use cited the lack of a follow-up study of its effects.

Mr. Thouin said the objections are sincere. "It's folks that are concerned about the lake...Some of the questions we've seen from the public are some of the

Why milfoil's a threat

Why is containing Eurasian watermilfoil on Lake George a concern?

"Milfoil is a highly invasive species," Mr. Thouin said. "And it displaces the native macrophytes, the native plants, and that can affect the entire ecosystem."

"If left unmanaged, it is extremely dense and can top out in the water column; it comes right to the surface. That can have impacts on boating, on swimming, certainly on real property values."

"It can have widespread and significant impacts, not only from an ecological and water quality perspective, but also on the things that run our local economy."

"Lake George is a big part of our local and regional economy. And reduction in water quality, or reduction in real property value would be serious for this area."

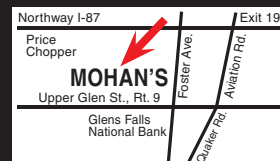

same questions that we've asked."

His reasons for believing in the chemical include its approvals by the Environmental Protection Agency and DEC, and the experiences of lakes including Saratoga Lake, Minerva Lake and Glen Lake.

Glen Lake: ProcellaCOR worked!

Paul Derby, who served as President of the Glen Lake Association from 2000 to 2018 and now chairs its environmental committee, gives ProcellaCOR EC rave reviews. Glen Lake introduced it in 2020.

"The water quality is improved. The recreational value has improved, the property values have improved significantly," he said. "We haven't seen any

interference with our fish population, which are very good on Glen Lake."

"We actually had an increase in the number of desired vegetation," he added.

Both Mr. Thouin and Mr. Derby said a positive of ProcellaCOR is that it doesn't need to be applied year after year; its milfoil reduction effects linger.

Eurasian Watermilfoil is often removed manually through "diver-assisted suction harvesting."

The LGA said the Park Commission's hand harvesting program is working. "The Commission itself has said will soon make milfoil 'a thing of the past,' a clear acknowledgement of the program's importance and success," the LGA wrote.

Limits of hand-harvesting

Mr. Thouin said hand-harvesting will continue regardless of the chemical's use, but that it's costly and inefficient. "\$8,700 per week, and that is for one diver under the water," he said.

He said there are myriad factors at play, but a "rough cost comparison" for diver-assisted would be \$15,000-\$20,000 per acre. For ProcellaCOR, it's \$1,000-\$5,000 per acre.

The Chronicle asked if it's hard to find

divers for the job. "It is, yes. There's only a few companies that do," he said. "It's labor intensive, and has specialized equipment, and that comes with a cost."

He added, "We've enjoyed an increase in funding in recent years, and again this year in the EPF, which we're sincerely appreciative for, but these are not levels that will be sustainable long term as far as funding."

Is the milfoil problem getting worse?

"The last few years, we've been lucky to have increased funding, and we've put that toward a capital project to go after the dense beds and the moderately sized beds," Mr. Thouin said.

"We haven't seen an increase in Eurasian watermilfoil, per se. But after 30-some-odd years, we're still working on some of the same sites that we started with."

"Unfortunately, although we've done a tremendous job of knocking back some of those big beds, and have certainly made progress, there seems to be room in the toolbox where we could use this in areas that are troublesome, and we can't use physical means."

Her perspective on LG herbicide milfoil dispute

Here's an updated article Ginger wrote for the digital Hague Chronicle about the current Lake George herbicide-milfoil fight.

The Lake George Park Commission (LGPC) applied for and was granted on April 14 a permit from the Adirondack Park Agency (APA) to put the herbicide ProcellaCOR into Lake George at two pilot sites: Blair's Bay in Glen Burnie and Sheep Meadow Bay in Hulet's Landing. Although both sites are located on the east side of the lake, they are part of the Town of Hague, whose boundaries extend to the eastern shoreline.

The LGPC feels that this herbicide could be an effective way to combat Eur-

asian milfoil, an invasive species that has been in Lake George for decades.

Working with partners, including the Lake George Association (LGA), the LGPC has, for several years, used hand-harvesting to try to control the plant. It notes that nearly 68 tons of milfoil were removed from the lake using this method in 2021. Now the LGPC wants to test ProcellaCOR as an additional tool to manage this weed, noting that it's far more cost-effective than hand-harvesting. The LGPC plans to apply the herbicide at the two sites as a pilot in June of this year.

The LGA and Chris Navitsky, Lake George Waterkeeper, are strongly opposed to using this chemical, stating that "there simply is not enough science about the potential adverse impacts to water quality, human health, and aquatic plant and animal life to proceed at this time, particularly given the unique and complex character of the Lake."

They asked the APA to deny the current application until more peer-reviewed scientific data that is specific to Lake George can be collected. The product information label on the manufacturer's website describes ProcellaCOR as "a herbicide for management of freshwater aquatic vegetation in slow-moving/quiescent waters with little or no continuous outflow." This

Rock returns to Cool: Breaking Benjamin Tuesday

Chronicle Managing Editor Cathy DeDe writes: Jeff Mead, General Manager of Cool Insuring Arena, said Tuesday they've sold between 2,800 and 2,900 tickets for the Breaking Benjamin concert on Tuesday, April 26, at 7 p.m. Tix: \$39 to \$129, with VIP options available. Box office: coolinsuringarena.com.

It's the arena's first rock show since Covid, said Mr. Mead. "We need at least 3,000 (tickets sold)," he said. "We'd like to get to 3,500. Typically the last week is good for us."

The post-grunge hard rock band from Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, came out in the early 2000s with a string of hits including "Diary of Jane." They'll be joined by special guests Seether, of South Africa, and openers Starset and Lacey Sturm.

Glens Falls is the band's third stop in a 17-show tour starting Friday, April 22, at the SNHU Arena in Manchester, New Hampshire. They're at Mohegan Sun Arena in Connecticut on Sunday the 23rd, then Tuesday in Glens Falls.

Covid protocols will be "minor," Mr. Mead said. "No masks for fans. Some backstage masks as per the tour's request."

Scoop: Keeping up pace?

Are you keeping pace with the news!? Not easy.

A judge struck down the federal Covid mask mandate on public transportation. Instantly United Airlines told crew and passengers they could take the masks off. Delta, Southwest and others followed.

What I found most interesting is that the Biden administration did not immediately appeal and seek a stay.

Look how quickly New York's Democrats got one when a judge struck down its Congressional redistricting plan that so clearly discriminates against Republicans.

Someone on Twitter suggested that the Biden administration actually welcomed the judge's action, that it knows how unpopular the mandate now is (and that it's a loser politically, said the commenter). So it doesn't have to take an action that might unsettle its mask-devoted base, but if a horrible Covid surge follows, it's a Trump appointee to pin the blame on. (They appealed Tuesday.)

Speaking of New York's gerrymander, do you



think there's any chance the state's Democrat-appointed highest court, the Court of Appeals, will uphold the judge's original edict and thus force drawing of a less baldly partisan map?

Some state courts have in fact gone against their ruling party. It would be a breath of fresh air if our Court of Appeals asserted its independence in the same way.

Is there actually a chance New York would elect a Republican governor? Again the obvious answer is no. But the sudden resignation of New York's second in command Lieutenant Governor Brian A. Benjamin — after a bribery and fraud indictment — certainly reflects terribly on Gov. Kathy Hochul's having just selected him. People are being shot on the New York City subway. The whole state and nation are stressed out.

WRGB earlier this month said a poll showed Gov. Hochul "just four percentage points ahead of the presumptive Republican candidate Lee Zeldin" — 35 to 31 percent, the rest undecided. (Do you trust polls?)

They both still have to win their June primary first, and there's a half-year until the election, but if ever New York's GOP can dream of winning one, it has to be 2022.

The situation in Ukraine looks bleak and ghastly again, after several weeks of perhaps misplaced giddiness. A way has to be found to stop Russia, end this war.

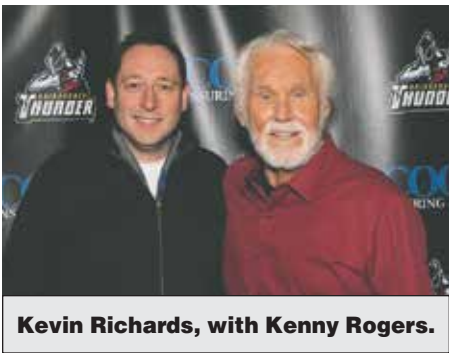

Kevin Richards, local line dance leader 30 years, free dance party to celebrate

Kevin Richards celebrates 30 years of Country Line Dancing in Upstate New York “with a **free ‘Wild West Line Dance Fest’** at the Wild West Ranch/The Barn at French Mountain” on Route 9 in Lake George on Friday, April 22.

“I fell into it and I never got out of it,” the Corinth native and CMA winner says of his dual careers in country music radio and “line dancing-entertainment.”

Mr. Richards says his highest accolade was winning Country Music Association Radio Personality of the Year in 2006.

“Radio brought me to line dancing,” Mr. Richards says. Country music, he got growing up in Corinth, from his mom and grandma. “They were big fans of the classics.”

“At 12,” he recalls, “I was on the air at WSCG, a small little station in Corinth, but it was the big country station here. It was walking distance from my house.

“I don’t think anything ever would have happened if I didn’t live near that station. I won a contest to be on the radio, and then I just started hanging around. The people in the town, the ladies in Town Hall, saw how excited I was to do it, so they figured out how to get me a child actors permit.

“They rooted and supported me to make it happen. I am so grateful.”

That was 1986, the start of his radio career. In 1992, along came “Achy Breaky Heart,” Billy Ray Cyrus’ massive hit. The crossover MTV music video introduced this new thing called line dancing.

“It changed the world. It started popping up in New York City, all over the world, and line dancing exploded in the 90s. A lot of bars went country, even in the City.

“I was working at a local station, I think WBAR on the corner of Maple Street here in Glens Falls, and we said, we’ve got to do it. I learned two, three dances. Our first dance was at O’Toole’s in Queensbury. Nobody knew what it was. I didn’t

he said “we looked at Saratoga” and considered “building someplace else.”

But “we came to the conclusion that we wanted to stay downtown, keep the culture going” by being adjacent to the original office and extending their downtown roots. He notes that its Loomis & LaPann agency has been “a Glens Falls institu-

tion since 1852.”

A bigger factor? “**We watch too much HGTV,**” the Gohns said. “Because of HGTV, we always wanted to do a building downtown.”

Mr. Gohn said in 2018 he approached Achenbach Jeweler Judy Pontiff and that she was instantly agreeable to selling it.

The Gohns chose Rick Chase to do the renovation/rebuild.

“We worked with Rick before. He did our house. I always trust his gut,” said Mrs. Gohn. Mr. Chase, who said he’s been in the business for 36 years, noted he built Mrs. Gohn’s mother’s house too.

He said the 220 Glen project “was right in my wheelhouse.” As issues mounted, he said, “there were days I wasn’t sure how far he [Mr. Gohn] wanted to take it” but “the scale of the project I didn’t have a problem with at all.”

From the roof, which needed replacing, to the basement, where part of it was dirt and there was “a hole in the cast iron” septic pipe, there were big problems.

Mr. Gohn declined to reveal how much they spent on the rebuild, beyond “a lot more than we anticipated.”

Beyond supply chain issues, soaring cost of materials and difficulty getting subcontractors and employees, in “peeling back the layers, the onion if you will, there were a lot of problems.”

He admits to wondering “what did we get ourselves into?”

On the back wall, “**when they started going up to take the windows down, it was all crumbling** so they had to take it all down quick to save it.”

He credited Rozell Industries. “They know just what they’re doing. To them it was just another day at the office.”

As planned, the back of the building was extended toward the Elm Street parking lot and an elevator was added.

Mr. Chase said in gutting the building **they took “close to 600,000 pounds” of debris** away.

“We were loading a 30-yard dumpster twice every day,” said carpenter Denis Mullins.

“Plus my trailer all summer,” added Mr. Chase.

He said, “There was nothing usable,” although when they installed windows

Classic is the emphasis in most of the 210 Glen renovation. The exception is the basement, starting with its checkerboard floor.

“I want it to be cheery, a little funky,” said Mrs. Gohn.

Mr. Gohn says, “People are used to working from home” now. “This is almost like working from home. You’ve got a nice kitchen, a nice place to be, but you’re getting out of your house.”

“Plus everybody likes to cook in our office. They like to share a meal. So this was a big component when we designed it, we gotta have a tricked out kitchen for everybody to —”

Mrs. Gohn completes the thought. “They do a nice Thanksgiving dinner together, but their kitchen [at 228 Glen] everybody’s sitting here, there and everywhere else.”

Mr. Gohn says the space will double as an informal meeting space. The tables can be slid together, and there will be a monitor on the wall for Zoom meetings.”

The 220 Glen renovation includes a spacious two-story apartment, mostly on the third floor plus the front of the second floor looking across Glen Street. The **Gohns imagine moving into it if they sell their house** and retire. Even sooner, Mr. Gohn said **their three children** — two in Boston, one in Seattle — **already "want the apartment,"** for when they're back in town. "That'll be **party central.**"

on the all brick north wall, the brick they cut out they used to build the fireplace in the apartment's third-floor living space. All the electric, the HVAC is brand new.

The insurance agency will use the first floor and the basement. At the back of the second floor is an unfinished space. "This is going to be a rental" for a business, "so we'll build to suit," said Mr. Gohn. "But nothing would make me happier than having to bust through and come up here." He said they have 30 employees now and are looking for more, plus they'd like to acquire other agencies as they did Loomis & LaPann. Which staffers will move into 220 Glen? "I'm going to come over," Mr. Gohn said. "There are some people who have been long-standing — when I first moved back, I worked in the basement — so that we call them the cellar dwellers. There are some long-standing cellar dwellers that need some sunlight. They get first choice."

Mr. Gohn adds, "Jean Moon, she's 87. She hasn't worked since Covid but she's still on the payroll." He said as Covid ebbs and the new project is completed, "we're hoping that she'll come back." Mrs. Gohn mentions "the small town feeling" that's been part of the rebuild. She said it's been a "labor of love" for vendors and contractors. "People took a personal interest in it." She mentions picking up fixtures she ordered at Askco Electric. "They're so invested in it," she said, that they enthuse, "This is for Jen's project."

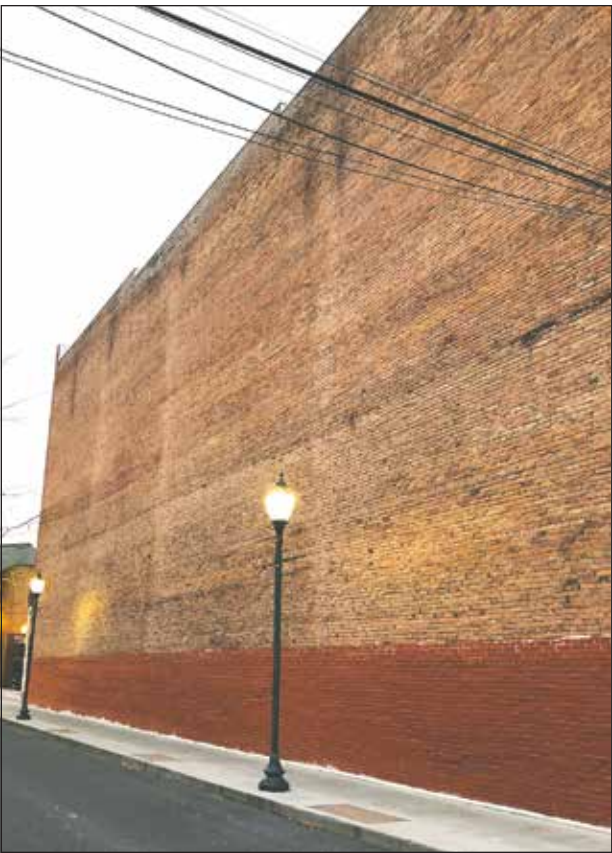

In 5 minutes fire can engulf house; 5 step safety advice

Editor's note: The following release arrived from an organization called **SafeHome.org**.

In less than 5 minutes, a small flame can turn into a life-threatening situation at home. In fact, about 80% of deaths from fire occur in the home. Homeowners may not be able to prevent every single opportunity that presents a fire hazard but there are measures you can take to minimize these risks.

SafeHome.org has developed a residential fire and safety guide to ensure fire safety at home. The following includes tips from firefighters, the Red Cross and a fire and life safety specialist:

- **Install smoke detectors throughout the home.** Having a working smoke alarm provides you with a 50% better chance of surviving a fire. is not the profile of Lake George.

Some of the other concerns include how long the toxic chemical will remain in the lake, the fact that ProcellaCOR eventually breaks down into chemicals that are as toxic as the parent and the fear that decomposing milfoil could even increase the risk of harmful algal blooms.

At its April 12 meeting, the Hague Town Board considered the arguments before unanimously adopting a resolution stating its opposition to the application of ProcellaCOR in Lake George at this time. The public is also concerned. Of the 325 public comment letters received by the APA, 300 expressed opposition to the use of the toxic chemical in Lake George — more than 90 percent.

Some reminded the APA that thousands of people use Lake George for drinking water, and they feared the herbicide's potential adverse effects.

Many said they wanted additional scientific study about the effects this herbicide could have on plant and animal life in the lake. Some also pointed out that, for many years, DDT was considered safe — until scientific studies proved that it wasn't.

At its regular meeting on April 14, the APA Board listened to a staff presentation recommending approval of the LGPC's application before narrowly approving it by a vote of 6-4. One Board member noted that one of her reasons for voting against approval was the fact that Hague's Town Board was unanimously opposed to granting approval.

either. I'm not a dancer, never been. We did the same three dances for two hours."
He says, "I never thought it would last 30 years. I think it is appealing entertainment that enhances your lives. Especially for older active adults, I think it, for a lot of people, it becomes their lives."
What makes a line dance? Typically, it's a pattern of 16 to 32 steps repeated over and over, Mr. Richards says, "The difficulty varies. It's not as popular today as it was originally but we have found a way to make it succeed."
He says country bars are harder to find these days. Now he offers lessons and dance nights at skating rinks, community centers, Rivers Casino, cruise nights on Lake George.
"It's not cowboy hats and Stetson boots. It's usually a lot of women, like a Zumba class but more a lifestyle than exercise, and it's very family friendly...."
"What I like is, it's being able to have fun listening to the music I like, rather than just sitting, listening and drinking a beer in a bar. It's very social. You meet the nicest people."
"A lot of people who come, you can see, they've had a life change, lost a partner, new to the area. Line dancing, all you need is yourself. People come and they get hooked. It changes their life. That's my greatest joy, and I see it over and over again."
Mr. Richards says his own grandmother took it up at age 80, and is still dancing weekly with him at age 94, "95 in September." He has dancers in wheelchairs, those with developmental dis-

abilities, young kids, "even teenagers, too cool for school," he says.
"I try to create an environment of welcoming. Anybody can dance. You do what you can. A lot of it is about building self confidence."
At onset of the Covid pandemic Mr. Richards says he shifted "immediately" to Facebook Live and Zoom: "We never missed a week of dancing. I'd have 50-60 people consistently on Zoom."
As restrictions lifted, they'd do in-person "driveway dances" at core members' houses across the region— plus a big group dance at Double M Western Store in Ballston Spa, and several dances outside at nursing homes, to entertain the residents, including one "very cold" Christmas dance in December.
When gyms opened, they called it "Country Cardio" and social distanced indoors.
Returning in-person at the Fun Spot in Queensbury since February, "we had 117 people last week. Demand is back again."
Mr. Richards currently DJs a morning show for Albany Broadcasting's Big Country 107.1, out of Latham.

Tyler Russell says he comes from a family of "serial entrepreneurs," and the newest venture for him and his wife Julia Sanzen is a major plunge into returnable bottles and cans.

The couple bought the former Stewart's property at 255 Ridge Street (across the street from the new Stewart's) in Glens Falls and have opened Rocket Recycling.

Mr. Russell said they also purchased 88-90 Main St. in Hudson Falls, where he says they're approved for a second location.

They plan to open in Queensbury, too, but don't have a location yet.

Mr. Russell says they've invested "many tens of thousands of dollars" buying state-of-the-art machines made by Binghamton company JK Peris to speed the process of handling the returned beverage containers.

also owned and operated the **Farm-er's Hardware restaurant** in Saratoga Springs. Tyler said they exited the restaurant after “two years of the hardest work we’ve ever done as individuals for survival” during the pandemic.

“The risks are too high, and the return on investments is too low for us to contin-ue as restaurant owners,” he said, citing Saratoga’s seasonality and high rents. Reached by phone, Tyler said he’s still working at StoriedBoards. “I’m here right now. I’m covered in sawdust. And that’s my full-time job. But the other full-time job is now Rocket Recycling.” He says manager Allegra Christidis handles “the moment-to-moment opera-

tions,” while he and his wife “run it from the top down.” He says the advantage of the bottle re-demption business compared to running a restaurant is that “you could shut off the lights and go home at the end of the day. This business seemed to check all the boxes. Support for the work life bal-ance while still being entrepreneurial.” Some bottle and can redemption cen-ter operators, like Jade Eddy at MT Re-turnables in Queensbury, urge the state needs to increase the handling fee cen-ters receive. Tyler said, “Hey, I would always like the opportunity to make more money...If we aren’t making money, then we don’t have a business. We don’t have a livelihood.” But, he adds, “I wouldn’t be going into this business if I didn’t think that it could work for me at the three and a half cents. “Does that mean that it works for ev-erybody? No. But we believe that we can make it work,” he said.

they were in school, I would have agreed that our mascot was a respectful image. My opinion was rooted in ignorance. The Tribes have spoken. It’s time we listened. From the Haudenosaunee Statement on Mascots: “The Nation regards the depiction of natives as mascots defamatory to our people.”

Among the reasons why: “Natives are the only race depicted as mascots Society has to recognize the inappropriateness of cultures being made into caricatures, put on helmets, t-shirts and bumper stickers. The fact that schools and organizations have “always” been the Braves, Chiefs, Warriors or Indians does not give the community the right to defame a culture.”

The Society of Indian Psychologists have also issued a position statement on Native American mascots, part of which reads: “We believe that it establishes an unwelcome academic environment for Indian (students, staff, and faculty) and contributes to the miseducation of all

members of the campus and community regarding the cultural practices and traditions of an entire ethnic group.” Ironically, these two school board candidates also oppose a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion policy, arguing that we don’t have those sorts of problems here. It seems that moving forward, it’s important to acknowledge that we all have something to learn, and to proceed with humility and open minds. The Saint Regis Mohawk Tribal Council Statement of Native Mascot and Cultural Appropriation ends this way: “The time has surely come for all of us, regardless of origin, to feel welcome, included and respected.”

Mission and Value statements, you will see that this topic is already addressed and, by most accounts, working well. My kudos to the staff and administration. In its simplest terms, it boils down to the golden rule: “Do unto others as

you would have them do unto you.” In modern language: Treat people as you wish to be treated. If students hear this at home and at school on a regular basis, I think you’ve done all you can to prepare them for the challenges they will face after graduation.Do we really need another “Progressive” policy which simply restates what has already been said? In this year’s school board elections, there are three open seats. Maryanne MacKenzie is the only current board member running for re-election. The new candidates are Linda Clark, Lisa Doster, and Chris Picard. Ms. Clark and Ms. Doster have voiced their opposition to the D, E, & I plan as it is written. Their reasoning for opposition is clearly stated in a recent interviews. They, along with Mr. Picard are rightly concerned that Lake George may be following the “progressive” path of creating a solution in search of a problem that simply doesn’t exist. At the very least, these candidates want input into any final version of this so-called “policy” that does not take us in a direction we don’t have the need or desire to go in. Based on this and the idea of having fresh perspectives on the board, I am

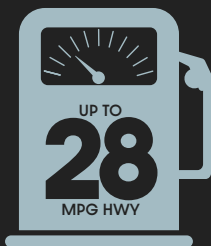

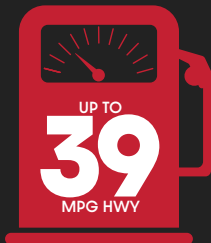

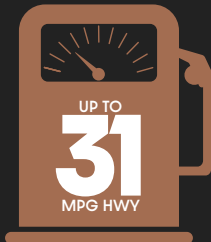
