Queensbury **Hotel expan**sion nears completion

It might not look it from the bevy of construction workers, building materials and rough edges seemingly everywhere. but owner Ed Moore and manager Tyler Herrick are sure the Queensbury Hotel's \$3.8-million expansion will be done in time for their planned ribbon cutting and community celebration on July 21.

"It has to be done," owner Mr. Moore prods Mr. Herrick. "The Police Chiefs are coming July 24." That's the New



York State Police Chiefs convention, July 24-27.

Mr. Herrick actually expects construction to be done by the middle or end of June. "I'm very excited. It's really going to bring the entire property together, and after 6-plus years of renovations and major projects we will have the opportunity to settle in a little.'



Yet another accident occurred in downtown Glens Falls Sunday, May 29, at around 12:40 p.m. at the parking lot on Warren Street near Centennial Circle.

Glens Falls Police Sergeant Gerald Willette told The Chronicle officers said the driver of the silver vehicle seen in photo was exiting the parking lot across the street and "didn't see the traffic coming, stepped on it to avoid the traffic and was unable to control the vehicle when it left the roadway and ended up where it is now." A light pole and a section of fence were knocked down in the crash.

Sgt. Willette said "everyone's fine," but the driver of the silver sedan is "going to be treated due to the circumstances of the accident, looked at by EMS.'

He said he was unsure if anyone was in

Boats by George teases a premium boat club venture

Chronicle Staff Writer Zander Frost writes: Boats by George owner George Pensel told The Chronicle that starting "a premium Boat Club...may be something in our future.

"But first things first..." he hastened

to emphasize. "We would have to get approved with the Lake George Park Commission.'

Mr. Pensel said he tried a boat share program in 1990 "at the King Neptune lounge in Lake George Village, but at the time my business too young, and not enough capital to carry it and get it started."



What makes it more appealing now? "Well, first of all, it's more of a proven machine that works. We see it working at Freedom Boat Club," the international boat sharing franchise that Matt and Becky O'Hara brought to Lake George in 2016. They operate it now in the former Dunham's Bay Marina, re-

named Queen Boat Company. Plus Mr. Pensel said, "It helps cultivate new business; new owners, people may start out there and then move on.'

"It's a little different from the rental business, because you're dealing with somebody who learns and understands what they're doing," he said.

Mr. Pensel said he prefers this approach over renting to "somebody new every day. They may not know anything."

He said, "Freedom Boat Club is a very good boat club, they have nice boats. But there are people that want the premium boat, the Cobalt or the Chris-Craft or the high end. That would be a possible area that we would be very natural to serve.'

Boats by George's move into LG Forum maybe August 2023

Boats by George's move into the former Lake George Forum building that George Pensel bought has no completion date.

"An idea would be this time next year. Maybe, maybe not," Mr. Pensel told The

"I'm not a builder, and I haven't got all the bids in yet...My expectations would be maybe August of next year."

That hasn't tamped his excitement. "This facility is going to allow us to do so

much for the boating community." We'll have seminars, we'll have boating courses. We have a beautiful facility there. It will be a great event location, and our store is going to be massive. And that whole cafe area will be retail," he

Retail will include "our paddleboards and our watersports products, to souvenirs...We're very close to the Village and we'll be seeing some tourism there.'

Mr. Pensel said he still sees tremendous opportunity for growth on Lake George.

He said he was recently "combing the shores" of Lake George with a boat dealer friend from Seattle. "We were saying to ourselves, look at how wide open the market still is," he laughed.

"There's a whole lot of old boats out there. There are a lot of docks that will get new boats.

Does he want to be the one to sell those boats? "Well, yeah, I mean that's what we do. We're very good at it. And the seasoned boater wants our brands," specifically citing Cobalt and Chris-Craft.

When they trade, they want to move up in the rankings. And there's no place to go but these brands in the sport fiberglass boats," he said. — Zander Frost

tive, he first developed the French Mountain Commons outlet center in Queensbury and also operates the Log Jam Outlets across the road.

Mr. Herrick and Mr. Moore's son Zack operate the Spruce Hospitality Group, which runs the Q and Mr. Moore's

Fairfield Inn at Exit 18 in Queensbury. The Queensbury Hotel expansion will accommodate bigger groups, more events.

"When all spaces are complete...max capacity for any single meal service period would be about 1,000 people," Mr. Herrick said. "This would be in addition to our normal 200 covers for dinner in the restaurant spaces."

Nearing completion on the hotel's north side is the Adirondack Ballroom that can be used as a single 5,700 squarefoot space or divided into three rooms.

"When the three spaces are open," said Mr. Herrick, "it's the Adirondack Ballroom. Then we can break it up into the ADK East, ADK West, and the new space is ADK North. East and West will still be about 1,100 square feet each and then North will be about 3,500."

The new, separate **1,000-square- foot banquet kitchen** will be dedicated "100%" to large-scale events, Mr. Herrick said, with layout, prep space, hot line, dish pit and walk-in cooler-freezer designed for serving numerous meals simultaneously.

A new "blast chiller," still to come, will "quickly and properly cool prepped food for safe storage" and best taste, he said.

Capacity of the new ballroom ranges from **425-450 people** for a plated dinner with minimal AV setup, to around **350-**

375 for a normal wedding with a sizeable dance floor. "For a trade show or cocktail party with limited seating we will be able to do **700+,"** Mr. Herrick said.

"Pre-pandemic on some busy event weekends we would do **600-700 ban-quet dinners** with events in the Ballroom, Gold Room, Warren, Adirondack and Albany Rooms," said Mr. Herrick.

"Already on numerous weekends this fall we will have a large event in the new ballroom and then a **150-175 person wedding** in the existing Ballroom/Gold Room.

"Our sales team is selling, and if there is an open room they are pushing hard to fill all the rooms every day."

Mr. Herrick said the Q has **94 employees.** "If we were fully staffed now we would have **another 10 bodies** or so...We have **11 bodies** in the kitchen now (excluding dishwashers). When fully running we expect to add at least **3-4 more** bodies just from a culinary standpoint. Front of house servers etc, are about **35 now,** with plans to add **at least 5-10 more.**"

How many people are working on the construction? Between the general contractor V&H Construction crew and subs, Mr. Herrick said there are **about 15-20 contractors** on site every day.

Phinney Design did the design work. "As of Friday they were painting, installing light fixtures, and installing the new HVAC units on the roof," Mr. Herrick said. "This week we are starting the kitchen equipment install and sheetrocking the last hallway outside the Warren

Room."

Tuesday morning they were deciding on

final shades of grey to paint the walls.

The renovated Warren Room will serve as pre-space for weddings, banquets or gatherings, and still be a presentation room on its own.

The Saratoga and Washington Rooms across from the Warren Room have been transformed into open, pre-event gathering space that will flow from the new hallway and bathrooms created previously across from the pool.

New Washington and Saratoga Rooms have 'moved' upstairs, off the second floor mezzanine, in renovated guest suites now equipped for small events such as a bridal dressing party or even a Fantasy Football league meetup, Mr. Herrick suggested.

The Adirondack Ballroom will have an **outdoor patio** area as well.

The Hotel plans to add a **theater-style marquee entry canopy** over the Ridge Street hotel entrance, leading guests directly to the front desk, Mr. Herrick notes. He points to heavy grommets in the wall where such a feature previously existed when **the hotel opened in 1926.**

They aim also to install a "blade" style sign (like Davidson's Restaurant has) on the Ridge and Maple Street corner of the Hotel. That idea they first floated in 2016, Mr. Herrick said.





HF standoff: Suicide

The Hudson Falls Police Department said David Greenwood, 59, died from a self-inflicted gunshot wound after an 8-hour standoff with police on May 28.

Police said they responded to Meadow Road for a report of a woman locked out of her residence by her boyfriend. When they arrived, the woman said her boyfriend had broken her phone and locked her outside after an argument.

An officer said he saw Mr. Greenwood in the residence's backyard and that as the officer approached, Mr. Greenwood pointed a semi-automatic pistol at him.

Officers moved to a position of safety and said Mr. Greenwood fired a round.

sisted and established a perimeter. Local residents were asked to stay inside until the situation concluded.

The announcement was made Sunday, May 29, in a letter from Superintendent Beecher Baker posted online.

"We would like to thank the people who 'saw something and said something," the letter said. "Please continue to report concerns to school administration.

The district said it has been in contact with Saratoga and Warren County Sheriff Departments, "who will take appropriate action with the individual today.

Beatrix Potter, need you now

Beatrix Potter is famous but not nearly as famous as she deserves to be. During our twoweek trip to England from which my wife Sandy and I returned last Friday, I became steeped in Beatrix, who lived from 1866 to 1943. Sandy led me to her.

We spent our first several days in the Lake District, the achingly beautiful agrarian landscape which be-

came Beatrix's home, inspiration, passion and cause.

Beatrix is famous for having written and illustrated the series of children's books telling the Tale of Peter Rabbit and other personified creatures. The books were best sellers when

she wrote them, from 1902 to 1922, and are best sellers still, a century later.

Ms. Potter was also a scientist. She painted exacting renderings of mushrooms and other flora she saw and studied. The chauvinistic establishment rejected her submissions, but her depictions of plants have likewise stood the test of time, respected and authoritative now.

Beatrix was gutsy and forceful. She didn't undersell herself, negotiating hard with her publisher for the price she felt she deserved. She was a century ahead in comprehension of merchandising — urging what would now be called "brand extensions," selling figurines and board games based on characters she created.

All impressive, but there's much more. Ms. Potter became an ardent preservationist — of not just the Lake District landscape but of its entire, rooted way of life.

She practically single-handedly saved its unique, hardy, charming breed of sheep — the Herdwick — and the elemental of-the-earth farms that raised them and did the grueling work of trying to

make a living from them. Ms. Potter raised some Herdwicks herself, and then started buying farms when they were

threatened by development. She didn't just save the sheep, she saved the farmers. She made the protection per-

petual by deeding some 4,000 acres of Lake District farmland to



the National Trust. Essentially she created a national park all by herself.

Because we live in an age when every simple thing gets complicated, what Beatrix thought permanent may not be. The National Trust's priority has become "rewilding" — returning land to whatever it was originally. These "fells" (mountainsides) have been sheep farmed for centuries, but the Trust may doom the farms, farmers and sheep despite Beatrix's express aim "to preserve traditional fell farming practice." Arguments on both sides.

Americade was cancelled in 2020 and ran a smaller version in September 2021.

"We're excited to return to normal," organizer Christian Dutcher told The Chronicle.

This year's Americade launches "WRAP" — Women Riders of Americade Program.

"Designed by and led by women," Mr. Dutcher said, it's a set of events — almost all free and open to the public, whether you're registered to Americade or not.

related items and services from airbrush painting and pin-striping to oil changes and new tires. Also: Clothing, jewelry, accessories, leather, food and more

Daily entertainment is by Elvis Tribute Artist Joe Ramsey — who will also do straight-out Country music sets this year, Mr. Zibro notes.

"Even if you don't ride, there's something. You gotta come."

Mr. Zibro said he started the Rally in 2001 in downtown Warrensburg, "next to the Post Office," as a free-admission alternative to Americade's Tour Expo. He argues, "I didn't like having to pay admission, just to go in to buy something."

Americade, June 7-11, offers numerous tours, outings and an extensive schedule of programs.

At the Warrensburg Rally, Mr. Zibro says, "We have no registration, we don't charge; it's free to attend. People can come back as many times as they want

This year he expects about 40 sellers will set up tents. In past years he says that have had as many as 50.

The two years of Covid cancellation were tough on his vendors, Mr. Zibro said. "Several just plain retired or quit, some because the companies that supplied them went out of business. It's a chain reaction."

He said even the paperwork, the Postal Service, has gone more slowly since Covid. "Everybody is facing a kind of holding pattern," he said.

"We're fortunate," Mr. Zibro says. "We still have vendors returning who have been with us for many years, and we have a lot of new vendors.

As of Monday, he said, "There's still space available for more."

They don't organize rides, but they'll provide "word of mouth" suggestions to motorcyclists who ask, Mr. Zibro said. We do it individually. It's nice."

The event receives Warren County Oc-

cupancy Tax funding They have a request for \$20,000 still in process.

"For the first 11 years we got nothing, but then the County came forward and they've offered to help out, every year. We are very grateful."

Mr. Zibro estimates over 84,000 people attended the most recent Rally in June 2019. "We tape the highways at three locations outside the fairgrounds to monitor how many people come in," and from there estimate one and a half people per vehicle, he said.

Besides local motorcycle enthusiasts, they draw guests "from Canada, Florida, Arizona, California. We collect the zip codes." Mr. Zibro savs.







At Americade: Liza Miller, podcaster & motorcyclist to Pakistan

Motorcyclist Liza Miller of Santa Cruz, California, is one of the guest organizers of a new focus on women motorcyclists at the Americade Motorcycle Rally this week, June 7-11 in Lake George.

week, June 7-11 in Lake George.
It's called "WRAP," or Women Riders of Americade Program. Its events are free and open to the public, men and women, both, as well as to Americade registrants.

How did Ms. Miller get into motorcycling? "I was born this way," she replies.

"I was obsessed with bikes for as long as I can remember. I was that five-yearold kid in the back of the family station wagon waving out to the Hell's Angels, yelling 'Nice Hog."

Was it a family thing? "No. My dad worked for the Department of Highway Safety."

Today, Ms. Miller, 55, rides far. She'll speak at Americade about "Chickistan" — a series of motorcycle tours to rural Pakistan for American women riders.

"A friend of mine who lives in Pakistan has a program, inviting bikers to come and see what the country is really like, to change American perceptions of Pakistan one rider at a time," Ms. Miller says.

"I went, and I loved it. So I start thinking to bring more people there, and planning these women's motorcycle trips.

We're doing our third one in September."

She says, "A lot of people think Muslims hate Americans. That's not true at all. It's like saying the Ku Klux Klan represents all Americans. When you go, you are treated like a guest of the country. Everybody wants to take care of you. It's the opposite of what you would expect based on Western media."

Ms. Miller also hosts the Motorcycles and Misfits podcast. She said she has 3.5 million listeners and "we'll hit our 500th episode at the end of this year."

Additionally, "I run a cooperative garage space called Re-Cycle Garage, where people with motorcycles come and we help them learn to fix them. People hang out and tell stories. A community has grown around it. I thought, wouldn't it be great to bottle and share that."

Ms. Miller also happened to have a back.

Ms. Miller also happens to have a background in sound engineering.

She said a friend from the Pakistan trips happens to live in the Lake George area, and invited Ms. Miller to do a program on Chickistan at Americade.

"I love everything motorcycles, so I said, put me in, anything I can do."

"I have to be honest. I never heard of Lake George," she admits. "Embarrassingly, my father is from Tarrytown but I'd never been there. I had to look at a map to see where it was.

"I'm so excited. It's one of the most beautiful parts of the country."

Quoting herself she recalls learning, "Oh! You have *a fort*! What! Hold on, that's a *big* lake! I had no idea. I'm excited to experience the whole week."

way from even with males.

He says, "It's not very pragmatic in terms of numbers, but we are looking at creating a well-rounded multi-faceted event that appeals to many different styles of riders" — from cruisers and tour bikes to all-terrain adventure bikes.

"We want Americade to cast a wider net, attempt to be relevant to lots of different markets," including, he hopes, "a little younger demographic. I'd love to see an increase in the 30- to 40-year-old riding demographic."

Big on demos, Expo, tours

Perennial attractions continue. "It is still noteworthy," says Mr. Dutcher, "that Americade has the most motorcycle demos of any event in the country. That is, if you want to try out a motorcycle, this is the place. Even dealerships don't have the things we have.

"There's nothing like putting your leg over a motorcycle to see what it's really like. We have tons of factories coming. They're like the candy store, and you're the kid."

Centerpiece of the events are guided and self-guided tours of the Adirondacks, the Green Mountains and throughout the region.

The annual Great Charity Ride for Kids returns Saturday, June 11, expanded to a two-hour guided outing around Lake George, with lunch, to benefit the Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation. It's free to all riders, registered to Americade or not, by suggested donation of \$40. Meet at 10 a.m. at the Fort William Henry.

Also returning is the Tour Expo, "massive" trade show with "about 200 ven-

dors, demos, and displays from most major motorcycle manufacturers," as well as catered dinner boat cruises, stunt shows, comedy shows, an ongoing daily festival of motorcycle related films, and more.

'Tough out there'

Mr. Dutcher says advance registrations are "relatively good," but "the telling and greatest impact is the week-of people. They will surprise us. We're not sure how many are coming."

Americade was again granted \$50,000 in Warren County Occupancy Funds. "We're grateful," Mr. Dutcher says. "Every year, the event is a collaboration between ourselves and countless local entities, from hotels to our staff, volunteers and the county."

"It's been rough," Mr. Dutcher says of the last two years. "The tourism industry was off 30 to 40 percent. I was off 100 percent."

One chilling reality check, Mr. Dutcher says: "It's worth noting, the International Motorcycle Show, by far the biggest one out there, with dozens of destinations, all big, 10 days ago went out of business. They were the 100-pound gorilla."

Boat supply crunch eases for dealers

EZ Marine & Storage in Brant Lake, said they have around 35 boats in stock.

How do they have so many? "Pre-pandemic, we only had four different brands to sell...We're getting anywhere from 30% to 70% of the boats that we would normally get from each manufacturer."

'So we had the foresight to run out and pick up more boat lines, we added five more," Alumacraft, Bayliner, Hurricane, Manitou and Polar Kraft.

"I've actually seen an increase in the amount of boats that we've had available," Mr. Mance said.

EZ Marine is "landlocked," and boats they sell end up "all over, within a three hour radius," Mr. Mance said.

Each year, he said, 10 to 12 go to Brant Lake, 2 to 3 to Lake George, and the majority to Lake Sacandaga.

Boats by George owner George Pensel said they also have new boats in stock. 'We have record sales, we've got a few [new boats]. We're holding on to some, just so we have boats to show."

He said they have increased used inventory. "A lot of our business is replacement business." As new boats are sold, "we're getting used ones in."

Michael Billow, Sales Director for Pilot Knob Marina, revamped under the new ownership of Boston software entrepreneur John "JD" Donnelly, said, "We've got boats that were coming in, but everything as it's coming in is being sold rather quickly.

"But we've got a good amount of inventory that's coming in, I'd say towards the end of the year and to the end of the summer," referring to their Chaparral line.

Supply chain issues aren't over

Supply chain issues have come at the boating industry from different angles, and while easing, they're not gone yet.

The pontoon industry is able to supply us a little better," said Mr. Pensel. "Resin has been an issue for the boat builders; fiberglass boats."

"We're starting to see some parts shortages and deliveries," he added. "But we've done very well. Our boat builder Cobalt is very creative."

Mr. Mance said some dealers have inventory, but "are waiting on motors for them, because boats are one issue, motors are another."

"Even trailers were a problem for a while. But fortunately, that's now getting better," he added.

EZ Marine: Who

Chronicle Staff Writer Zander Frost writes: "The rental business is still pretty hot," says Josh Mance, sales manager at EZ Marine & Storage in Brant Lake.

"All throughout the pandemic it was huge because everybody could rent a boat and get away from other people. It's not as hot as it was the last two years... but it's still booming, far more than what it used to be pre-pandemic," he said.

He said on an average day five of their six boats are rented. He expects a busy summer — and said it already started strong over Memorial Day weekend.

Demand is easing, to a point

Mr. Brodie said, "I think nationally demand is starting to peel back a little bit and manufacturers are starting to catch up. We're definitely still behind.

"There's still some pent-up demand," said Mr. Mance. It's not as much as what it was over the last two years, but this year looks a little bit more like 2019. But there's still more buyers than there are boats.

Last year during the pandemic, dealers

told The Chronicle customers were buying boats to get outdoors. Is that changing?

Mr. Brodie replied, "No, I think people were just reintroduced to outdoor activities that they had overlooked...And I still think that they're interested."

Yet, "so much has been put out onto the market in the past few years. Prices have risen, gas prices are through the roof. I don't think it's pushing people back inside. I just think the demand for new boats kind of petered off or plateaued."

Mr. Pensel said, "So far the rise in interest rates doesn't seem to have stopped people from financing their boats.

"We have a lot of demand here — may-

be the backlog is shortening but that's maybe because we're into the season, and people are really trying to get something if they don't have something.

"Instead of a backlog, they're taking what we have," he said.

Who is buying all these boats?

Mr. Mance said, "The last two years we saw an unbelievable amount of first-time boat owners. This year, we're seeing more of the traditional mix."

Mr. Brodie echoed this thought, "Definitely during the pandemic was a huge, huge surge on new, first-time boat owners. Some...two years later, we're seeing them upgrade to newer, bigger boats.'

Who rents boats? "It depends which marina you're talking to," Mr. Mance said. "Lake George is almost completerents boats varies ly tourist, very, very few locals


At EZ Marine, "it's somebody that comes up every single year and they rent a house or a cottage on the lake and it comes with a dock," Mr. Mance said.

'So they rent the boat from us. Sometimes just the weekend. Sometimes it's four or five days. Sometimes it's one or two weeks.'


'We love those customers because they don't beat those rental boats up. They use them every year."


