Revolution Rail buying North Creek-Tahawus 30-mile railway

Revolution Rail, which pioneered a railbike business

bidder

launched in North Creek that it has since taken national, is buying the North Creek to Tahawus rail line.

The price is \$2.7-million. Revolution Rail finished

second at a bankruptcy auction in March when it tried to buy the 30-mile rail line for recreational and freight use, but the high bidder — Doc N Duchess Rails LLC — failed to make the required down payment.

Revolution Rail stepped up. "We have an approved purchase agreement," Edward



LaScala, Revolution Rail's Director of Operations, told *The* Chronicle on Thursday, June 2.

William Brandt, who has overseen the sale, confirmed the Bankruptcy Court okayed the deal. "I think it's a great outcome. It's a win win" that he said is sensitive both to forest protection and maintenance of the railroad for freight use creating industry job opportunities.

Mr. LaScala said, "We believe

in the environment and we believe in the economy. We're committed to both those things at once — that's what's been missing.

What remains is for New York State and the U.S. Department of Transportation's Surface Transportation Board to sign off, which is anticipated imminently.

Alas, we were on time but Delta wasn't. The Departure screen said our flight was 30 minutes late. Then an hour. Then at around 11 came the



Max Yurenda, Double H chief since its start, to retire

Max Yurenda, the only CEO the Double H Ranch in Lake Luzerne has ever had, announced he will retire next March after 30 years at the helm.

"Double H officially opened its doors on July 4, 1993 and has served over 80,000 children dealing with life-threatening illnesses from around the world all completely Free of Charge," said a Double H press release. "It was the second 'Hole in the Wall Camp' in what has become a worldwide network of not-for-profit recreational and therapeutic experiences for children with serious illness."

Mr. Yurenda was quoted: "I am incredibly proud of this organization and the impact we have made. I am humbled and grateful for having this opportunity to witness the power and magic of the Double H experience that will continue to flourish into the future."

Charlene Wood, a Double H Board Member and trustee of the Charles R. Wood Foundation, was quoted:

"Max...was selected as CEO by my dad, Charles R. Wood, as he saw the potential in Max and knew he could carry out the dream and goals he had for this local camp modeled after Paul Newman's Hole in the Wall Camp in CT.

"Max's leadership skills have made Double H Ranch a star in the Serious Fun Children's Network. He will be greatly missed but I know he will leave the camp in the hands of a great team he has cultivated over his many years of service."

Double H Ranch encompasses 320 acres of land with waterfront access to Lake Vanare. Its cabins can accommodate 126 campers, 125 staff and 50 volunteers. "Program areas include an indoor and outdoor pool, a high ropes course, archery, horseback riding and pasture, picnic pavilion, stage area, dining hall, arts & crafts, ski lodge and two winter ski and snowboard slopes."

June 13: Public update on GF's **South St. plans** by Mayor & **Sonny Bonacio**

On Monday, June 13, Mayor Bill Collins and developer Sonny Bonacio will present their plans for the South Street-Elm Street overhaul and the Market Center that are core to Glens Falls's use of the \$10 million Downtown Revitalization Initiative grant awarded in 2016 by then-Gov. Andrew Cuomo.

The Monday, June 13, meetings will take place from noon to 2 p.m. at Crandall Public Library and from 6 to 8

p.m. at the Park Theater.

"Even without the parking garage," Mayor Collins said, referring to controversial plans for the Elm Street lot (see separate box), "we are looking at \$38 million in development.

"South Street is the last major corridor of Glens Falls to be upgraded. It's why we got the DRI money to begin with."

The mayor said they hope to bring the DRI projects in July to the Planning Board, which typically meets the first Tuesday of the month, thus July 5.

The centerpiece is the Market Center to be built by the City where the OTB parlor stood. It will house the Glens Falls Farmer's Market and an events center.

Designed by Envision Architects of Troy, the Market Center is proposed as an open air building shaped like a birch leaf and featuring hinged, slotted "walls" that can lift up as shades in the warm months or be lowered as protection from the elements in winter. There would be a performance stage in the back south corner of the lot, delivery access for trucks, and landscaping that takes the place of the prior "pocket park" DRI plan.

Mr. Bonacio, of Saratoga Springs, selected by Glens Falls to develop much of the DRI project, plans to construct or redevelop five buildings, under the entity "Spring City Development of Glens Falls." Mr. Bonacio's projects are:

- 46 Elm Street: Purchase and renovate the white long-vacant warehouse building once envisioned as a business incubator. It will connect with the Market Center, adding flexible indoor vendor and events space and commercial kitchen on the first floor.
- Hot Shots: Purchase and renovate the former bar for mixed residential-office-commercial use.
- Sandy's Clam Bar: Renovate building that Mr. Bonacio bought separately, not as part of the DRI, also for mixed use.
- New mixed use building: At the front of the current Farmers Market-parking

Board of Directors to lead the strategic direction of the organization.

- Strengthening financial sustainability for the organization.
- Encouraging an all-inclusive and welcoming environment that promotes an "I can do it" attitude.
- · Establishing a reputation of excellence in the community and NFP sector.
- Leading a successful inaugural capital campaign for the organization with the completion of numerous capital improvements to enhance the accessibility and experience for all.
- Pivoting the organization throughout the COVID Pandemic and successfully providing alternative and virtual programs for our campers and families.

When The Chronicle interviewed Mr. Yurenda five years ago for a special section marking Double-H's 25th Anniversary, he said the camp's launch in 1993 was "a true roll of the dice. What we were leading with was passion and heart."

Canoe Island Lodge for sale: \$11.9-million


The Canoe Island Lodge on the west shore of Lake George is for sale for \$11.9-million, reported The Albany Business Review Tuesday.

It's listed by Davies-Davies & Associates Real Estate LLC, said the Business





Scoop: Be travel ready...

the bum-out. Flight cancelled. No getting out tonight. At 8 a.m. on Saturday morning in Glens Falls I was supposed to have breakfast with a college classmate I hadn't seen in literally 50 years, just before they left for Iowa. Texted my regrets. "Wasn't meant to be," said I.

Delta made a slew of cancellations. On Saturday they cancelled more than 250 flights, 9% of the schedule.

They didn't announce our cancellation. It was posted as a line of type on the Departures monitor.

A vanguard of thwarted passengers
— no doubt experienced in these situations — high-tailed it three gates over to

what turned out to be the customer service counters. We scurried in pursuit.

The line initially extended across the main lobby of the terminal. Personnel ordered us to reassemble so that we stretched the other way, down the Delta lane.

We ended up waiting in this line for two-and-a-half hours. And we were fairly close to the front. I looked at what must have been 100 to 150 people in line behind us (maybe from cancellations besides our own) and realized they'd probably be waiting until 2 or 3 a.m.

The mood was pretty calm considering what a pain it was. In my case, I mean literal pain. Standing in one place for hours makes my back ache.

Only one thing saved me. The Baltimore Orioles. I was checking on my MLB App the score of the O's game against the Boston Red Sox. We were losing 8 to 2 going into the seventh inning.

Then we scored 3 runs in the seventh inning. Now I resumed following the play-by-play. We scored 3 runs in the eighth inning! The game was tied! Then we scored 4 runs in the ninth inning and won 12-8. Miraculously my back didn't hurt anymore!

Sandy, meanwhile, as usual, focused on the matter at hand, utilizing the well-chosen apps on her iPhone.

Advice: Have a smart phone and know how to put it to best use. Travel is becoming impossible without it. Delta texted a voucher for a free hotel night and food credit. Sandy pounced on that, scoring us a room at

the Airport Marriott, with 24-hour shuttle service. We got friendly with a couple from Clifton Park just behind us in line. They weren't as up-to-speed app-

wise and didn't know to grab the room immediately. The only time a Delta employee actually spoke to our crowd was when one came out and warned us that you'd best act right now, that the hotel rooms run out.

Another person who was trying to get to Albany, whom we'd spoken to earlier when we still had hope our plane would leave, was flying up from Florida to work

Memorial Day weekend at the Chateau in Bolton. People ahead of us in line who managed finally to get

to the service counter came away shaking their heads. No sure seats to Albany on Saturday with Delta. Sandy turned to her Southwest Airlines app. She found a way for us to get home Saturday by flying from

Atlanta to Fort Myers, Florida, then switching to a plane that stopped in Orlando and then flew to Albany. Sandy had enough points built up in her Southwest account that we didn't have to pay any of the \$900

price. She grabbed the last two available seats. Our place in line finally reached the Delta rep. He wanted us to sign up for stand-by on Saturday morning. Delta would comp us another hotel night. He could only guarantee us a seat if we waited and flew Sunday.

The Saturday stand-by didn't interest us at all. There's no way there'd be a seat available.

We asked the Delta rep if we could get back the luggage that we'd already checked. "No," he said, but he said it would be on the Saturday morning Delta flight to Albany. We could retrieve it at the Delta office near the conveyors at baggage claim.

Southwest delivered us on time to Albany. The sun,

low in the sky, breaking through clouds, made a spectacular arrival. (That's my photo at

right.) The airport was

quiet, largely empty. The

Delta luggage office was closed. Sandy went and, amazingly, found a helpful Delta staffer. Delta had texted that one of our bags, mine, got on the Saturday morning flight. The other two were bumped.

The Delta staffer opened the office and really tried to find my bag. It wasn't there.

It turned out none of our bags made it out of Atlanta on Saturday. They all came up on Sunday. Delta delivered them to our house in Glens Falls by courier.

Now Sandy is trying to get Delta to refund our money for the flight to Albany. They've initially only offered us points to use on a future flight. She also wants them to cover the cost of our Southwest flight that she spent so many of our Southwest credits on. Today, Tuesday, Sandy finally got to speak to a human being at Delta.

What's been most disappointing is how poorly Delta has communicated throughout the whole process. No human contact, no explaining what's going on. Sure, they're understaffed. So is everybody. Do bet-

ter. But as a traveler, be ready for anything. Society is breaking down, and air travel right along with it.

Glens Falls redraws lines; **Ward 4 much** larger; shrunk Wards 2 & 3

Looking finally to equalize populations of its five wards, the City of Glens Falls has redrawn the map. If approved by


the Common Council, the public will get the chance to vote on it.

Ward 4, which previously had just 1,883 residents, less than half the 3,884 in Ward 2, will get much larger in the proposed new map, while Wards 2 and 3 will see substantial decreases.

Now the wards will have populations roughly within 10 percent of each other.

Ward 4 in the new map extends from Broad Street and Hudson Avenue north



to Horicon Avenue and Crandall Park.

The redistricting committee, led by retired City Clerk Bob Curtis, will present its plans in a public hearing on Tuesday, June 14, at 7:25 p.m., prior to the Common Council meeting at 7:30. Both will also be streamed on YouTube. Details: CityofGlensFalls.com.

The City of Glens Falls has never done a redraw on the Ward Bound-

aries since the City's incorporation," Chip McTiernan, special assistant to the Mayor, tells The Chronicle. "It had been kicked down the road for many years and needed to be addressed.

Because each Common Council member's vote carries equal weight, the population disparity has long been seen as problematic and perhaps outright illegal.

The Warren County Board of Supervisors weights the votes of Glens Falls supervisors by the population of each ward.

Mayor Bill Collins said the state standard on representing district populations is a variance of no more than 10 percent.

The proposed new configuration ranges from 2,768 residents in Ward 4 to 3,228

The mayor said that when he was still a Councilman, Glens Falls resident and attorney John Caffry sent a letter calling for redistricting of the wards — and that triggered him to take it on as mayor.

Mayor Collins said the committee was explicitly instructed to be "not political."

He said the new lines keep current elected Council members and County Supervisors in their existing wards.

Mayor Collins's own residence would shift from Ward 2 to Ward 1. He's unaffected electorally because he's elected by the entire city.

To take effect, the committee's proposal must be approved by the Common Please turn to next page







Mayor: Taking input on parking hub plan at the Elm Street lot



"At the time, in 1834, there were newspaper clippings about her appearance, but no first-person account from her perspective," says director Shannon Tyo. Ms. Tyo originated the title character and played her the much-lauded recent Public Theater production in New York City.

For ATF, she switches roles, making her directorial debut.

"It's the most produced play in the United States this year," she said. "It's a beautiful play, and timely," noting the Covid pandemic that originated in China, "an uptick in violence against the Asian American communty." But she adds, "It's not a lecture. It's still very funny, touching, and deals with a subject in history that not a lot of people are familiar with.



got a lot of people pushing. There are a lot of people that are eager for us to take control of the track" — citing "green groups" like the Adirondack Mountain Club, Adirondack Council and Open Space Insti-

"They know we're the best stewards of the line."

Mr. Brandt said he expects the sale to close in the "next 30 to 45 days."

Mr. LaScala said of New York State, "we have an agreement with them. They're taking it through channels.

New York had petitioned the Surface Transportation Board to abandon the track, but the federal agency favors keeping railways in operation.

Mr. Brandt said the action "for abandonment is probably moot at this point."

The State wants to guarantee no empty tankers will be stored on the track, which of course we're not going to do," Mr. LaScala said. "We are Adirondackers and love the Park and the beauty of the Park and we're never going to do anything to jeopardize that."

Cars were stored on the track under prior ownership.

Mr. LaScala said he expects New York "will pull their request for a stay" and then the Surface Transportation Board will approve the sale to Revolution Rail.

SMS in Fort Edward handles freight

Mr. LaScala said they have the financing "completely lined up."

Mr. Brandt said Revolution Rail paid a \$500,000 deposit and added, "This is going to close very easily."

Besides recreational use, Mr. LaScala said, "We are geared to work with anybody that wants to move freight....When Barton Mines [in North River] or Paul Mitchell [Stone, in Tahawus] wants to ship freight, SMS can move it for us to the Saratoga interchange."

SMS Rail Lines — operator of short lines in the Northeast — has had a facility at Fort Edward since 2017. Its website says of the Fort Edward operation, "We serve industry in the region providing 'ondemand' rail car switching with array of logistical loading and unloading services as well as rail car storage. We interchange with Canadian Pacific Railway.'

Mr. LaScala said, "We have a very close working relationship with SMS Rail... We're running rail bikes on their line in southwest New Jersey — the Woodstown Central Line — gorgeous scenic rail" that is Revolution Rail's latest launch.

Their rail bike business also operates in Cape May, New Jersey and South Fork, Colorado. Mr. LaScala they're soon to launch in Kennebunkport, Maine.

Locally Revolution Rail operates four railbike lines — North Creek north, North Creek south, Thurman and Hadley.

Doc N Duchess touted titanium

Three bidders vied for the rail line at

the March 3 bankruptcy auction.

Doc N Duchess Rails LLC — formed by Carol McClean-Wright and her husband John Wright, of New Mexico — submitted the winning bid, \$3.33-million, but "they were not able to come up with the money," said Mr. Brandt.

He said that when the bidding exceeded \$3-million, he had told bidders that the unexpectedly high offers would require posting of an additional deposit that he said Doc & Duchess failed to provide.


Revolution Rail had submitted the second highest bid, \$3.32-million.

After the default, Mr. Brandt said Revolution Rail asked for its purchase price to be lowered because it said Doc and Duchess's defunct bid had inflated the price.

Mr. Brandt said that all parties agreed to Revolution Rail's \$2.7-million offer, "including the third bidder," Sierra Rail of California, which departed the bidding much earlier.

When Doc N Duchess's high bid was initially accepted, its co-owner Carol Mc-Clean-Wright was quoted in the Albany Times-Union describing stone in Tahawus as "an excellent source of titanium. That's our main goal."

The Adirondack Explorer reported then Ms. McClean-Wright "said she and her husband are determined to move forward because they view the work of obtaining a source of rare-earth metals — believed to be abundant in tailings from the old mine at Tahawus — as vital for national security." She reportedly said their financial backers in Europe couldn't move the money quickly enough during the Covid

pandemic to meet the May 6 deadline.

In 2016, in another bankruptcy auction, Ms. McClean-Wright bought the former 1000 Acres dude ranch in Stony Creek for \$1.405-million planning to "turn the resort into an instructional camp that focuses science, math, engineering and technology," said the *Albany Business Review*. The property was sold three years later.

Revolution Rail's origin

Revolution Rail says it was founded in 2016 by Robert Harte and Michael Dupee, who "combined their backgrounds in education and corporate sustainability, and passion for nature...

[T]ogether, they designed and built the company (and the bikes!) from scratch, partnered with a supportive local community in North Creek, NY, and launched Revolution Rail Company in July 2017





NYS Senate lines set new battles

Warren, Saratoga and part of Washington County are now in three separate districts, and a tense race between two Republican senators arose in one of them.

State senate and congressional primaries will be held August 23, delayed after the Democrat-drawn maps were ruled unconstitutional and had to be redrawn.

The petition filing period ends Friday, June 10.

Republican Senators Daphne Jordan and Jim Tedisco are vying, bitterly in the redrawn 44th District, containing all of Saratoga County and part of Schenectady County.

Ms. Jordan said in a press release that Mr. Tedisco "doesn't have the courage to run for office in his own Senate District because he's afraid he might lose to Democrat Neil Breslin."

Sen. Breslin won reelection in 2020 with 73% of the vote.

Mr. Tedisco's hometown of Glenville is not in the new district; Ms. Jordan's home in Halfmoon is.


Mr. Tedisco decided to run in Ms. Jordan's 44th anyway, and the Times-Union reported that he secured the endorsements of the Saratoga and Schenectady County Republican committee.

Liz Joy, Republican congressional candidate in New York's 20th district, endorsed Ms. Jordan.

Incumbent Republican Dan Stec may have a challenger — Democrat Jean Lapper - in the 45th district, which includes Warren, Essex, Clinton, Franklin and parts of Washington and St. Lawrence Counties.

Warren County Democratic Chairwoman Lynne Boecher told *The Chronicle* Tuesday that "we are collecting signatures this week throughout the district," but did not confirm for certain that Ms. Lapper, a CPA, is running.

Republican Assemblyman Jake Ashby and Democrat Andrea Smyth are vying in the 43rd District, which contains southern Washington County, all of Rensselaer County and part of Alba-



ny County. It includes Troy and Latham. Albany County Sheriff Craig Apple, a Democrat, had expressed interest but dropped out of the race last week in a

Facebook post. He said he will not endorse a candidate.

Ms. Smyth says she "served as the Executive Director of the New York State Coalition for Children's Behavioral Health for 18 years."

Mr. Ashby says he is a "former Army Captain who served two tours of combat duty, and today works as an occupational therapist and college instructor.'
