Elizabeth and Ben Miller's latest bold move is nearly complete. The mother and son developers have renovated the building at the corner of Park and Elm Streets, across from their building housing the Park Theater and Doc's Restaurant.

Doc's will be rebranded Park & Elm and move into the first floor. **Next to it will be a specialty deli and market.**

Sit-down restaurant successor to Doc's; deli & market; upstairs apartments; Park Theater event space.

People "are very enthusiastic about the market and deli side of things," says Mr. Miller. "As someone who's lived downtown myself, it's something that I saw as a big void in the community."

He said it will have "a full butcher counter with meat cut to order very similar to what you'd see at Jacob and Toney's up in Warrensburg...."

"We're going to feature produce from our own farm up on Ridge Road — Sunset Farm — as well as other local producers, local dairy, local eggs, that sort of stuff. We'd also like to have a nice little selection of craft beer."

LG Village decides Tuesday

The 667 voters in Lake George Village go to the polls on Tuesday, Sept. 13, to decide whether the village should be dissolved.

The vote was set in motion by a petition drive that officials said gathered 99 signatures.

Doug Frost led the petition drive. He points to the Laberge study that says tax savings could reach as high as 33% from state money that encourages eliminating layers of local government.

Village Mayor Bob Blais leads opposition to dissolution. He says the village and town are well-run and efficient, and that dissolution's benefits aren't guaranteed. *See more, pages 3 & 7.*

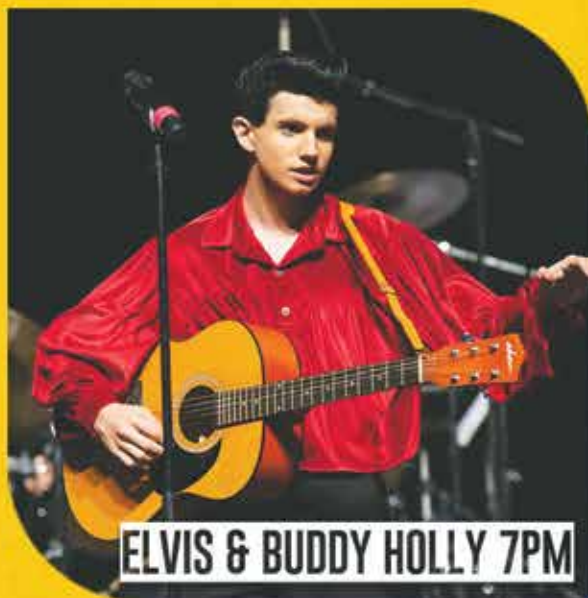
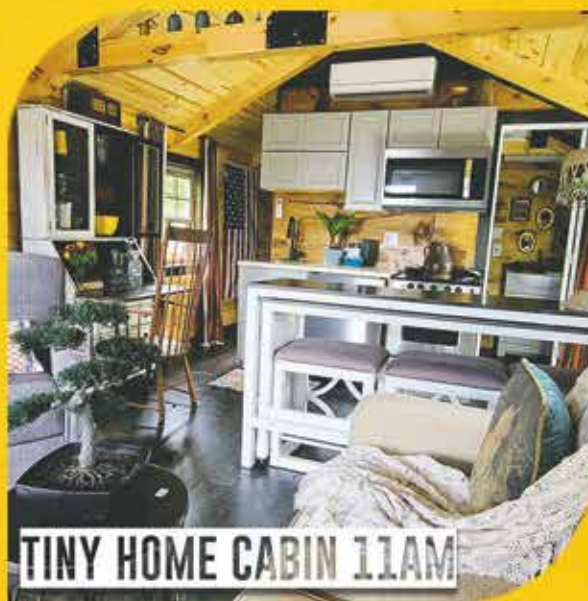

Doug Frost led petition drive; calls dissolving LG Village ‘win-win’

Doug Frost set in motion this Tuesday’s referendum on whether to dissolve Lake George Village.

“I look at this as a win-win situation,” he says. “...If it does not pass, the Village Board will follow through on its own study of consolidation and long term savings for Village residents.”

Mr. Frost owns the Tom Tom Shop and Mayard Center in the village and formerly owned Fire and Ice bar.

A nine-year employee of the Town Code Enforcement Office, he said he previously worked for the Village and served more than 14 years on the Village Board.

Last spring Mr. Frost and fellow Village residents John Cocozza-Hill, Jennifer Hawley and Robert Mastrantoni collected 99 signatures, enough to trigger the vote by the village’s 677 registered voters.

Mr. Frost said his “catalyst” was that “The Village Board was in the process of going to do their own study on dissolution or consolidation with the Town. Then, toward the end, they decided not to do the study. I was on the side of, you do the study and put it out to the voters... Let them decide what’s in the best interest of the Village. I don’t think five Board members should decide for everyone.

Mr. Frost says, “This was never about the Village not doing its job or any dissatisfaction with what is going on in the Village, but to allow us to see the numbers and facts.”

He says, “Personally, I believe it should

Mayor Blais: LG Village & town well-run; ‘nothing guaranteed’ if village dissolved

Lake George Mayor Robert Blais posted this message to Village residents on the Village Website:

“The State’s Incentive Program to eliminate layers of government and provide efficiencies was originally designed to assist communities struggling with a stable tax base, insufficient funds to provide necessary services, difficulty staffing appointed and elected positions and duplicating services that existed in neighboring communities.

“None of the above is the case in the Town and Village of Lake George.

“The study indicates on page 16, ‘The Village and Town of Lake George already share significant services and already have a strong well-functioning division of labor.’

“Later, on page 57, the study states, ‘The Village has a very healthy fund balance, a number of Reserves and owns a significant amount of property and equipment.’

“Now, voters are being asked to consider the dissolution of a 120-year-old, well-functioning village in only 90 short days: actually only 30 days after receipt of a draft report!

“A petition circulated by three Town employees without the knowledge of Town Officials has forced a vote within 90 days. The busiest 90 days of our year, creating a vote held the week after our large car show and a time of year that our largest taxpayers have little or no time to consider such an important question. Two of our public hearings must be held during the Adirondack Nationals Car Show!

Farm Wage Board backs 40 hour overtime threshold; farmers say it dooms them in NY

The state's Farm Laborers Wage Board voted 2-1 Tuesday to approve a report recommending lowering New York's agriculture threshold from 60 to 40 hours at which farms must pay overtime.

The change would begin in 2024, lowering the threshold by four hours each year until it reaches 40 hours in 2032.

New York Farm Bureau President **David Fisher**, who cast the lone dissenting vote, said the decision is "based on cherry picked data and inflammatory opinions."

Mr. Fisher said, "It barely touches on the testimony of how this will make our farms less competitive and how labor shortages are already a challenge and will only get worse if workers leave the state to seek more hours elsewhere."

State Senator **Dan Stencel** called the decision "disastrous for family farms."

Congresswoman **Elise Stefanik** said "these Democrats in Albany are doubling down on their reckless overtime decision, jeopardizing New York's agriculture industry, putting thousands of farm laborers out of work, and making New York less competitive by forcing our workers to seek labor opportunities in neighboring states, all while in the midst of a labor shortage."

Advocates of the 40-hour overtime threshold say farm workers should be treated like any other worker.

GF: Cooper Street facility coordinator charged with rape

Glens Falls Police said they arrested **Lauren Andrews, 31, of Fort Edward** on September 1 on charge of Third Degree Rape, a Class E Felony.

She is accused of having sexual contact with a person who is incapable of consent in June 2022 at the state operated facility at 50 Cooper St. in Glens Falls, Detective Seth French told *The Chronicle*.

Police said Ms. Andrews was employed by the agency at the time of the incident as an Assistant Coordinator, a role that made the victim incapable of consent.

The facility, which includes apartments, is operated by the Warren-Washington Association for Mental Health.

Ms. Andrews was also charged with Third Degree Rape for related incidents involving the same victim by the Washington County Sheriff's Office, police said.

Ms. Andrews was arraigned in Glens Falls City Court and released on her own recognizance pending further action.

Granville woman charged with neglecting 31 horses

On September 2, State Police arrested **Wendy L. Murphy, 54**, of Granville for 31 counts of New York Agriculture and Market Law-Overdriving, Torturing, and Injuring Animals.

Police said after executing a search warrant, they found the horses on Ms. Murphy's property; all appeared to be deprived of necessary sustenance, suffering from neglect, and were removed. Additional charges are anticipated.

Speaking of elections, a shocking poll came out Saturday showing Democratic Governor Hochul leading her Republican challenger Zeldin by just 48-43.

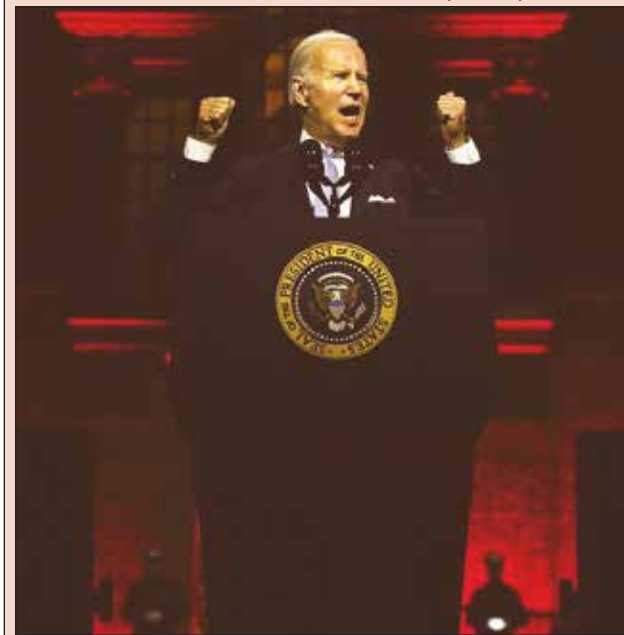

Hochul up by 30. But who knows? Who trusts polls? We'll know what people actually think come Election Day — or at least several days or weeks thereafter. If I were a betting man, I'm betting on Hochul, but then again Phil Murphy barely won re-election in New Jersey last fall. Republican Youngken won Virginia.

I like stories that cut both ways, show nuance inside of absolutes. Here's another headline in the *Wall Street Journal* that interested me: "Nuclear power's rebound causes rift among environmentalists." On the one hand: No nukes! On the other hand: No oil or gas!



Is anyone else uncomfortable with the increasingly aggressive Presidential imaging?

Chronicle editor Mark Frost writes: **In early 2021, looking at the Trump image shown at the right, I wrote "This is a very scary photo...the Trump stare being projected strikes me as Nazi-like — unnatural, hypnotic, menacing." I got the same creepy feeling from the Biden image** during his dangerous Republicans speech last week. What's with the red backdrop? What's with the soldiers (and their hands)? Strikes me as an intentional effort to make it all more ominous, scary, yes, even menacing. Red meat to rev up the Democratic base,

as Trump fires up his own. No more pretense of trying to unify and heal. On the national and state level, it's: Crush the other side; they're irredeemable. Man, can this nation survive? At a grass roots level earlier this year, I thought I sensed some rising moderation and tolerance — people wanting to get along with family and associates even if they disagree, dial down the disdain. Politicians — the ones all in on 'win at any cost' — aren't on board. Election Day nears. Angry up the base so they'll come out to vote. Maximize your turnout. Demonize your foe.

of over \$6,000,000 that offers the variety of services that we do, not only to Town taxpayers outside, but for millions of tourists annually is extremely complicated.

“The vote itself creates divisiveness among the community, pits neighbor against neighbor, creates rumors, assumptions and due to the short time period, much fear in the average homeowner content with the status quo.

“All this aside, the [Laberge] study predicts a savings for our Village taxpayers in the range of 27-33%. This savings, following Dissolution, comes from funds our successful government has generated over many years. But remember nothing is guaranteed to the Village taxpayers after Dissolution. Nothing!

“What is certain is that many years of unparalleled cooperation between the Town and Village will end. Shared Services that have saved taxpayers far in excess of \$400,000 annually will go away. Loyal employees will be affected, job duties changed and a decrease in service is possible.

“Village taxpayers’ ownership solely of a Fire Department, four parks, the sewer plant, water system, Visitor Center, will all go to the Town.

“As Mayor of this great village for 52 years I am obviously emotional about any Dissolution but sincerely want what is best for the future of this community and its taxpayers.

“Therefore, I am recommending to the Village Board, a creative, sensible, and practical solution to consider in place of the complexity and unforeseen circum-

pass. We should be looking for the long term not short term,” Mr. Frost said.

“I think we are a stronger community if we are together....There is enormous development and growth in the Town. The Town has a huge assessed valuation that I believe will help maintain savings and the tax rate. The Village is a small area and it is already built out. We are not going to see that same growth, while expenses will continue to grow.”

Mr. Frost says, “I don’t know what will happen. I think it’s up in the air, very close. A lot of people want dissolution. A lot want to see the Village remain. I hope that they vote based on correct information. That was the whole idea of the petition and getting the study in the first place.”

Asked what he thinks of 55-year Lake George Mayor Bob Blais, Mr. Frost said, “I think the Mayor has done some wonderful things for the community. This is not about Mayor Blais.”

After the referendum was triggered, the village and town paid for The Laberge Group of Albany to do a study of the impact — benefits and drawbacks — of dissolution.

The Laberge report said taxes would decrease substantially under incentives enacted by then Governor Cuomo to encourage layers of government to streamline

Mr. Frost says, “I do not think anyone had foreseen what it says, that we could see 29 to 33% savings. The study was eye opening for a lot of people.”

He adds, “The study shows most if not all of Village employees would transition to the town. That’s a great thing and one

stances of Dissolution: An investment that will lower Village taxes now and continue the excellent sharing of services that exist between the Town and Village.

“I am seeking a resolution [since adopted] guaranteeing the Village Board will transfer up to \$3 million from a parking meter savings account into our next year’s budget to reduce taxes by as much as 35%. [Mayor Blais told *The Chronicle* he expects the parking meter revenue will continue to lead to similar tax reductions in future years as well.]

“The funds were put aside only two years ago to cover unexpected costs associated with our construction of the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

“Our grants exceeded expectation by over \$5.4M [million], the plant has been completed on budget and we have covered the additional maintenance in our 2022-2023 budget.

“The Village has not raised taxes in ten years. Our present tax rate of \$5.79 is 25¢ less than in 2013. This part of our outstanding debt will lower the rate to \$3.85; a 33.5% decrease. Our Parking Meter Revenues continue to exceed our expectations and we should be able to hold our rate stable for many years to come. All of these funds would be lost in Dissolution across the entire Town.

“The resolution will also include asking the Village Board to support, subject to the approval of the Town, a detailed study of Consolidation and Annexation (also since approved), a study that may save both Village and Town taxpayers funds and one in which both Town and Village voters not only have an opportunity to vote, but have a reasonable amount of time to consider, research and gather facts to make an intelligent decision.”

Town Supervisor Dennis Dickinson also opposes dissolving the village.

more positive coming out of the study.”

Mr. Frost says, “I will always think of myself as a resident of the Village of Lake George. My family has owned a business here since the 50s. I love the Village of Lake George with all my heart. It’s been my family’s home forever. My mom was on the school board for 25 years. My dad was on the Village Board, was the village assessor and Police Commissioner. I want the community to see the benefits.”

He said, “It’s not an emotional thing for me. I’m not going to be sad if it passes or it doesn’t pass. I’m looking for a win-win for my community. We were hoping something would come out from this in a positive way.”

some veggies, six pack of beer and **take home everything you need to make a great meal.**

He added, "If you come to Doc's, or then [what will be called] Park & Elm, you have a great steak, you can get that same steak cut to order to pick up and grill yourself."

Matthew J. Delos, the executive chef at Doc's, will have the same role at Park & Elm. Doc's current space below the Park Theater will be used for special events.

Mr. Miller said they've developed **"a real demand for catering and events"** in the Park Theater building," necessitating this expansion.

He said that in the adaptable first-floor Park Theater space, "at the moment, anytime we have a wedding of more than 50 people, we've got to close the restaurant

[downstairs], because the kitchen can't support both at the same time."

Park & Elm's restaurants plus a catering operation, Park Street Hospitality, will share the large kitchen that runs much of the length of the newly renovated Park & Elm building.

Mr. Miller said the kitchen in the Park Theater building will continue to be used during events, but prep work can also happen in the Park & Elm kitchen.

Park & Elm's larger patio, with roof

Park & Elm will have a larger patio than Doc's and a roof over it.

Right now they're "at the mercy of the rain and the weather over at Doc's," said Mr. Miller. "We're putting a roof over this patio with four really big 8' by 10' skylights...to still let in all that natural light."

It will also have installed electric heaters. "We really want it to be **a true three-season space**," said Mr. Miller.

Mr. Miller said the new restaurant will seat 145 — 85 inside, 60 on the patio.

The deli will have counter seating for around 16 people, with plans to add 20 more "cafe style" seats outside.

Mr. Miller expects the deli and market to be open until 8 or 9 p.m. and include "basic groceries, even things as simple as paper towels, toilet paper, dish soap, that sort of thing."

But the main thrust is "a continental market and deli vibe," with meats, cheeses and sandwiches to order, and fast casual breakfast and lunch service.

Ben: Bagpipes to buildings

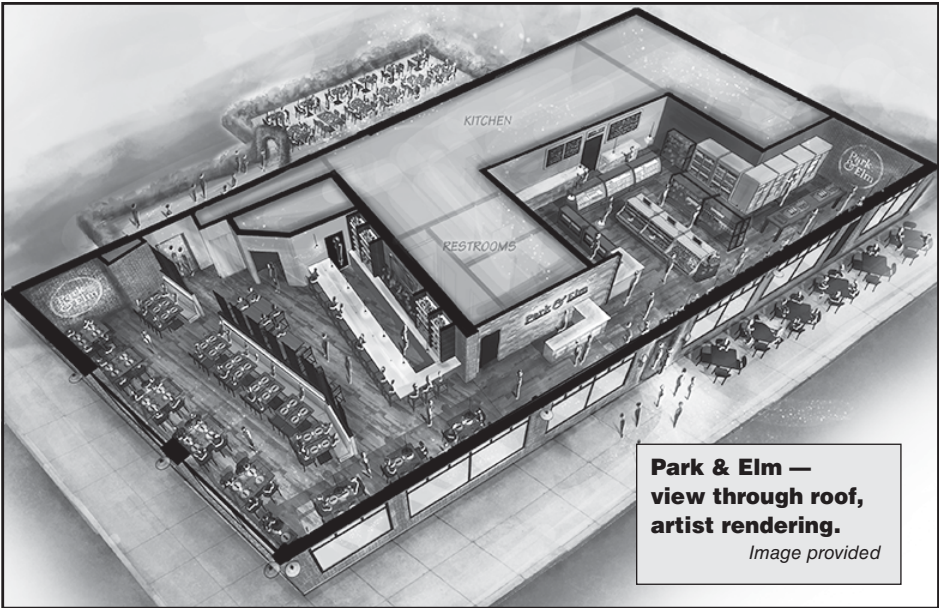
This is the first project that Mr. Miller has led. He returned to the area in 2020.

Prior to the pandemic, he played bagpipes as the member of a touring band, Miller-MacDonald-Cormier. "Our last show was actually at the Park Theater for St. Patrick's Day, right before COVID shut us down," he said.

He learned to play from the late plastic surgeon Dr. Harold Kirkpatrick, previous owner of the Park Theater, for whom Doc's restaurant is named.

"I did the music thing for the better part of 10 years, I did a lot of touring," Mr. Miller said. "But I also did a master's degree and started a PhD. And I wrote for a music magazine in Scotland for about five years," where he also lived.

He spent another five years in Nova

Scotia before moving back home for good.

He hasn't played professionally since. "I still play at home whenever I can, which isn't very often...Managing the restaurant and the construction project takes a lot of time," he said.

Does he miss it? "I do and I don't.

"Running that business wasn't worlds apart from running the business I am now. There's a lot more people that I'm managing now than then, but it's all of the same things.

"It's logistics, it's accounting, it's payroll, it's marketing...I always tell people it [his music business] was 25% playing an instrument and 75% business management."

Working with Cifone Construction

Mr. Miller said that on the Park Theater renovation, "I was involved in a peripheral way in the planning phase, especially in the theater end," because of his background.

He said on the hospitality side, "I just fell into that and learned as I went."

"My mother has got a lot of irons in the fire, she's got Miller Mechanical, she's got Doty Machine Works...So she is involved peripherally" in the Park and Elm project, Mr. Miller said.

"We work very closely together on the big-picture decisions, the aesthetics,

all of that, but as far as the day to day grind...I'm working very closely with Matt

Cifone.”
Cifone Construction of Glens Falls has been the builder on both the Park Theater project and now Park and Elm.
He “is a phenomenal contractor,” Mr. Miller said. “He’s mostly known for building luxury homes on Lake George.”
Mr. Miller said the restaurant’s interior will be “a little more modern than Doc’s.”
“We always like to try to capture the essence of the building that we’re in,” he said. “The Park was such a historic building. And my mother really wanted to capture that vibe in both the theater

space and the restaurant.”
This building, on the other hand, “was a very industrial space, a lot of brick, a lot of raw metal. We wanted to enmesh that with the fine dining idea as well.”
“We’ve got a great custom...quartz, sort of marble, bar top.” Plus, “stainless steel fixtures in there. Some oil rubbed bronze on the lighting and the window frames.”
“We’re very informally saying early fall” for project completion, Mr. Miller said. “The entire construction process has been so challenging with COVID, aside from materials, workforce, all of that.”
The biggest holdup “is the elevator addition that we’re building on the outside right now, that needs to be completed for our egress plan.”

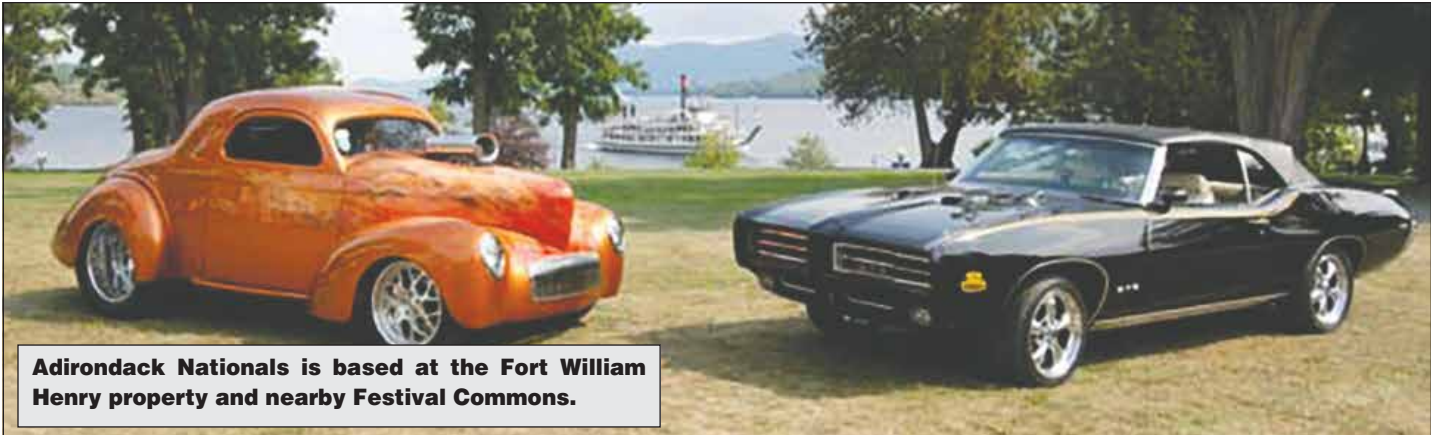

At sold-out Wood: Country music's Randy Travis & wife Mary, 9/11

When Randy Travis and his wife Mary take the stage for their **two sold-out shows this Sunday, Sept. 11**, at the Charles Wood Theater in Glens Falls, it'll be "something different," Mary told *The Chronicle* in a phone interview from Nashville this week.

The country music superstar and his wife, both 63, will give **intimate "Up Close and Personal" programs**.

"We haven't done that before," Mary says. "Usually it's a concert, with some talking too," when they're out on tour with their own band.

Kevin Richards, the local deejay who is this show's promoter and host, describes it as "A Conversation With A Legend," with an opening act of local singers Richie Phillips, Jenna Sue and Mark Pierre performing Randy Travis hits.

The program on Sunday: "We'll cover his life, his childhood, how he got started, and his acting career. Randy has lived such a colorful life," Mary says.

She defers to Randy, but does nearly all the talking in an hour-long conversation.

In 2013, Randy suffered a serious stroke as a result of viral cardiomyopathy. It left him partially paralyzed on the right side.

It also left him with aphasia — he is unable to speak or to sing, except in short phrases.

Mary recalls with detail the events leading to his stroke — they were on tour, in July, and he had congestion that looked like pneumonia but worsened quickly. Unable to breathe, Randy was hospitalized, and then "flat-lined," she recalls. He went into a coma, and then suffered a stroke that was not at first recognized.

The infection, doctors traced back to a documentary film session weeks prior in an old feed store, where they suspect "he picked up a spore or a mold," Mary says.

"From there, we had a high rate of speed change of life, a brick wall," Mary says. "It's tragic, but it's also a gift that he's still with us. Tested for a season, blessed for a lifetime."

It's made them advocates for others who suffer from aphasia — Bruce Willis, famously, and pro athletes they've met who experienced head trauma.

"Some people, they'll ask a question and think Randy is being rude because he doesn't answer. But he was always the

poster child for the time he spent talking with fans. Or, people assume you can't understand, but his comprehension is as acute as ever, if not better."

"Sometimes he gets blamed, people ask why is he even still out there, why not stay home — but that's not us. We're not homebodies. He still wants to touch people's lives. Words aren't the only way of communicating."

Randy can't use his right hand to strum a guitar, Mary says, "but his left is good. The chording still goes on, if someone else strums. He can mouth every word of the song but forming the words is a challenge." In a concert setting, with guest singers, Randy will close his chart topper "Always and Forever" with the single word "Amen."

Recently on tour with country singer Kane Brown, Randy chimed in unexpectedly on "Highway Junkie."

"It was beautiful," Mary recalls. "You just keep challenging those with aphasia and they keep shining. I call it 'giant baby steps.' Something small, but in our world it's huge."

"It's always fun and we laugh at ourselves and thank God every day," Mary adds.

Randy Travis is credited in the 1980s with nearly single-handedly reviving classic country music.

"It had gone a little pop-Urban Cowboy," Mary says. "In Nashville they told him, *You're just too country*. He was scratching his head at that. But he didn't vacillate."

Producer Martha Sharp at Warner Bros. famously bucked the system and signed Randy — setting off a revival of classic country.

"Randy came out with his album *Storms of Life* and turned everything around," Mary says, with Randy agreeing "Yes."

"The Dwight Yoakams, Garth Brooks, Clint Black, they were all making great music," says Mary. "Randy kicked the door open for the rest of them. They call them 'the hat acts,' but Randy never even wore a cowboy hat."

Randy is more famous for his embroidered jackets by designers such as Manuel Cuevas, Mary says, adding, "35 years later he still wears them."

In a recent visit to the renovated Warner Music Group studios in Nashville, she says they told him, "This is the house that Randy Travis built."

"We still go hear music as much as we can," says Mary but adds that "Randy's not a fan" of what she says he calls "7-11 singers: Seven words, 11 times."

Some favorites today? She brainstorms: "Kane Brown, Zac Brown. We live 45 minutes from Billy Bob's (Billy Bob Thornton's club in Dallas). There's a lot of good music that passes close to us. Alabama is still touring and what great guys they are. Tim McGraw. Cody Jenks is a great songwriter. Blake Shelton. Drew Parker is a youngster coming up. Jamey Johnson."

Of all people, they've recently befriended Bernie Taupin. Mary says the legendary Elton John collaborator stepped forward, unbidden, to write the liner notes to the new reissue of *Storms of Life*.

"He said many of his songs were influence, his writing came from Randy, his style, his choice of music, his writing, the melodies. He said he's followed Randy's whole career."

Mary says, "We've become friends. A sweet, sweet man, a mountain of a man. He's pennies from heaven, and there we were with the umbrella upside down."

It's not a surprise, Mary says, that even rock and rollers look to classic country music: "The tapestry of our lives is written in a country song," Mary says.

It's another moment, Randy chimes in, "Yes."

Words to the wise from Events to a T, Letizia Mastrantoni

Wedding planner Letizia Mastrantoni of Events to a T in Glens Falls notes: "Certain vendors, we encourage our couples to secure right away."

She says, "Once the date, venue and caterer have been selected, photographer, entertainment (especially if you are looking for a band), florist, transportation, hair and makeup and accommodations follow quickly after."

She says, "If you're thinking about hiring a videographer (which we highly recommend), they should be solicited right away as well."

"Basically, whatever is top priority to the couple should be booked asap. Vendors are booking extremely quickly. We are booking into 2024 already."

The time of year for your wedding plays a huge part in vendor solicitation. If you're looking into a late summer or fall wedding in the Adirondacks, it is never too soon to confirm your vendors, whereas selecting a date in the late fall-early spring, from November to April, you may find that prices are more reasonable and vendor selection more open."

Letizia adds, "My newest tip is 'be intentional with your guest list.'"

"Maybe it's because events were postponed for so long, but, we are seeing a much higher acceptance rate for wedding invites. Whereas in the past you could expect around 15-20% regret notice, this year it has been closer to 5-10% regret, which impacts budgets and spacing significantly."

Wedding advice from event firm on prioritizing & saving money

Chronicle editor Mark Frost writes: The following release arrived by e-mail at *The Chronicle* on behalf of a firm called **Vanessa Events, Production & Hospitality** (www.vanessaevents.com) led by Vanessa Ohayon.

1) Choosing your venue is where you want to start your savings — as it usually is the largest portion of the budget. For better pricing, choose off-season or mid-week to celebrate, and the venue is also more likely to throw in some free upgrades to sweeten the deal. Look out for what is included, but more specifically what IS NOT included, so later, you are not hit up with any surprise charges.

2) If choosing between a DJ and band, go with a DJ and add some live-on instrumental acts — like a saxophone, violin, or drummer. Bonus points if that musician can play a variety of instru-

ments or even better, hire multiple musicians to play separately and simultaneously. It is a game-changer to adding elements of surprise, and highlighting peaks in the evening.

3) With respect to the menu, there is the ongoing joke that people always complain about the food at a wedding. So, in that case, let them! Give consideration to the way a menu is designed, executed, and served to your guests, as you can save some coin in this area as well. Instead of having guests stand in line at a buffet, as opposed to the costly service option of paying for additional waiters to provide guests individually plated selections, choose family style and shared plates served to the center of the table for most of the courses.

4) Lighting is such an important element to any event, and is often overlooked, as people don't understand the magnitude of the impact it makes on the night. For outdoor events, string lighting is a favorite. It always adds that magical touch, without breaking the bank, while also feeling super authentic, and please make sure to get them on a dimmer! Of course, natural light in all its forms, daytime sunlight, and evening candlelight!

5) Before deciding to do a backyard wedding, investigate the extra costs that you might incur that would otherwise be

included with a venue. As much as I love a backyard whimsical wedding, I also know they can add unexpected expenses. Think rentals for tables and chairs, and glassware, silverware and plates too. Consider sound systems and lighting for the evening and the potential need for a generator — not to mention all the things you will feel you need to fix up now that everyone will be in your home :)

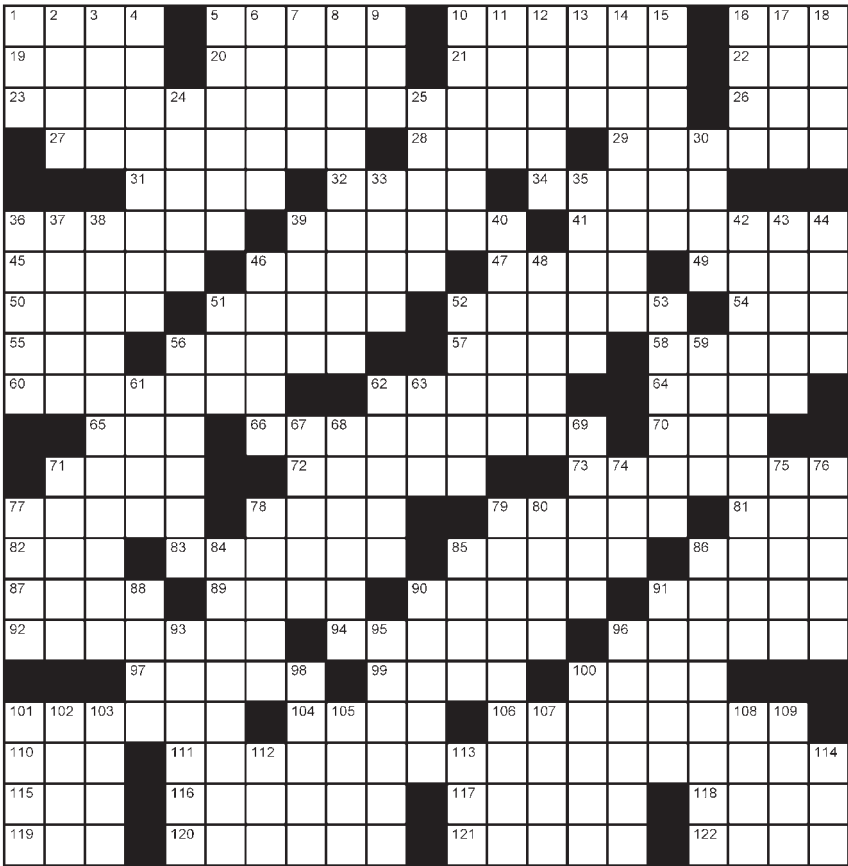

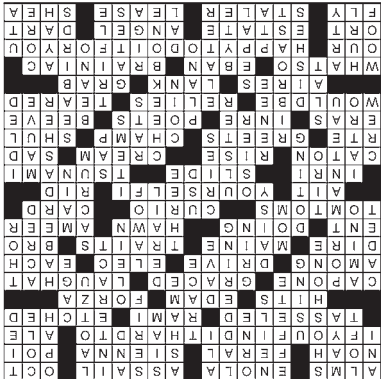

Huge Adirondack Independence Music Fest! Wow!

Chronicle Managing Editor Cathy DeDe enthuses, briefly: What a win for the Adirondack Music Festival, promoter Dave Ehmann and team. The crowds were surely the biggest ever for this 7th year of a festival that was much thwarted by Covid, including a last-minute cancellation in 2020 that nearly wrung Mr. Ehmann dry.

Crowds were friendly, swaying eagerly to the mostly jam bands. That's not this listener's first-level go-to genre. Still, Friday headliners Pigeons Playing Ping Pong, especially, put out two impressive, even convincing sets.

My favorites: Massive-voiced singer-at-large Hayley Jane, who sat in with several bands: She's a force for joy.

Bella's Bartok, on Saturday, knocked me silly with their slightly crazy-eyed blend of old-timey and indie music.

Another Saturday band, Root Shock, vibed the jam band sound with a blues edge. Note: Lake George has totally arrived, dudes, as a big-festival venue.

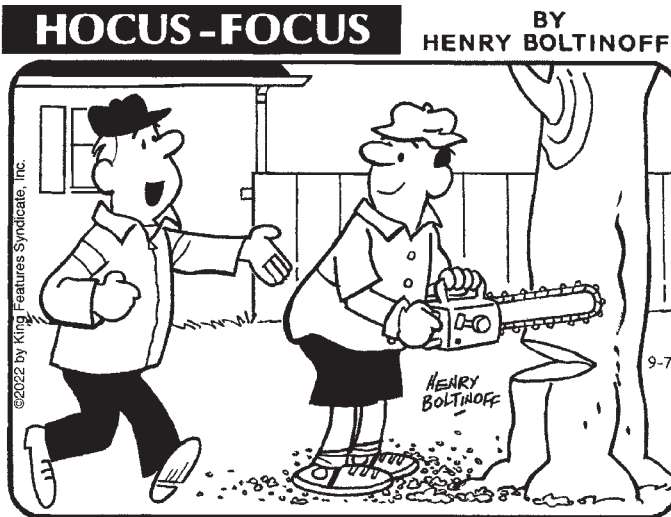

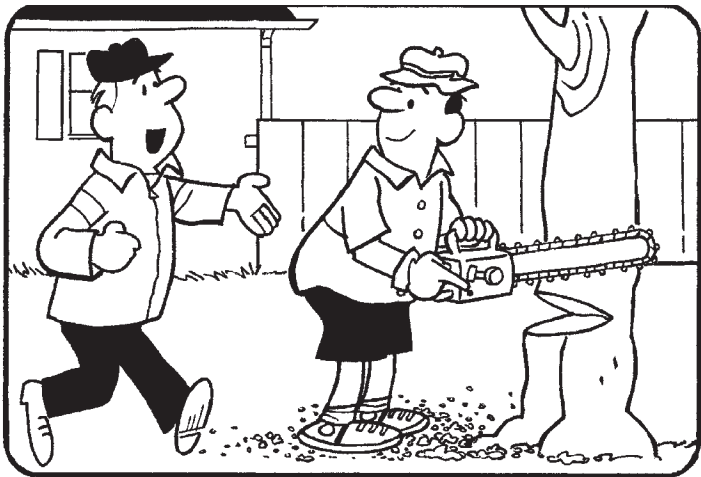
