

79 years later, finally 'I got to hug my father' who is buried at Normandy

Chronicle Managing Editor David La Point of Queensbury tells The Chronicle he waited 79 years to finally hug his father.

This was two months ago, a bittersweet moment that took place in the American Cemetery at Normandy, France, when

David embraced the cross marking where his father Leon C. La Point is buried.

Leon was a Private First Class in the U.S Army, 38th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. He

died when David was just nine months old, from wounds sustained on Omaha Beach in the D-Day invasion of World War II.
