Lois (Whaley) Askew of Glens Falls turns 100 years old this Saturday. There will be a big party at the Queensbury Hotel, more than a hundred guests, Mayor Bill Collins proclaiming it Mrs. Lois Askew Day, and “a lot of love in the room,” says Lois’s daughter Elaine Oates.

Fortunately Lois remains a live wire and terrific interview. Get her talking and she tells stories that amaze, her memory triggered by what Elaine terms their “plethora” of photos. “We are picture-taking people,” says Elaine.

Lois says, “I lived in Alabama — Montgomery, Alabama — and I had to walk to school because I didn’t want to go to the school that I was supposed

## Making film on Douglass Crockwell, seek backers

Mark Spitzer and Michelle Furlong — partners in Moving Balance Productions, LLC — are making a full-length documentary on Glens Falls's Douglass Crockwell, "one of the 20th century's most talented and prolific artists."

Ms. Furlong writes, "Our goal is to inspire our local community, young people, and the public at large about the outstanding accomplishments of Douglass Crockwell, a true renaissance man."

They've released a trailer for the film viewable at [douglasscrockwell.com](http://douglasscrockwell.com).

Ms. Furlong said, "We are actively looking for investors to help bring Douglass Crockwell's story to life. Douglass Crockwell's story is the story of Glens Falls!"

They're seeking investment to "develop this project into what we know it has the potential to be. Just getting digital copies of his films will cost almost \$15,000."

Ms. Furlong said they've "traveled to New York City, Vermont, Arkansas, and western NY to do research and conduct interviews. People have shared reminiscences of playing basketball at Crockwell's house, posing for photographs that were the basis for nationally famous illustrations, seeing his mutoscopes in action and even installing The Hyde security system with him!"

She said they are "working closely with Megan Tierney-Ward, Crockwell's granddaughter, who has given us full access to Crockwell's archive of personal letters, sketches, inventions, and photographs."

### Who was Douglass Crockwell

**The Chronicle's Sandra Hutchinson** wrote a long profile about Douglass Crockwell in *The Chronicle* in 2002 and updated it in 2016.

"Operating from his studio on East Sanford Street, Mr. Crockwell created illustrations that frequently became covers of *Saturday Evening Post* magazine, as well as seeing wide use in advertising, calendars, murals and portraiture...."

"But Mr. Crockwell's story is also one of lesser known but highly regarded achievement in science and avant-garde art. He invented cameras, made films shown at the Museum of Modern Art, and collaborated with David Smith, the Bolton Landing (N.Y.) abstract sculptor viewed as one of America's dominant artists of the 20th century."

"Yet Mr. Crockwell was as down-to-earth and involved in Glens Falls as he was intellectually adventurous. His friends often posed for his commercial art; they talk of these days with a delight..."

"Mr. Crockwell was also a civic leader — chairman of the board of the Hyde Collection from 1952 until his death, a school board member, catalyst for creation of the Glens Falls Tennis and Swim Club."

I love the option of using an Airbnb or VRBO for accommodations while in town. Have spent many hundreds at the Landmark Motel near my family, but that place has gone downhill....It is also very expensive. I gladly welcome new and affordable short-term rental accommodations.

She was doggone misled

Our first (only) experience with airbnb was January 2023. We booked 7 weeks in North Myrtle Beach after leaving 1+ month in FL where we’d gone for 12 + winters. Our SC trip was intended to let us explore the area for a winter 2023/24 extended winter stay which would be a change of scenery and easier mileage wise for us.

We arrived at the rental we’d booked in a residential golf community with a short walk to the beach. Airbnb and host Vacasa had advertised the 3 bedroom/2 bath home allowing up to 4 dogs. We arrived with our 70 pound Black Lab and we loved the home!

In the morning, we walked Lager and met several owners who informed us that owners could have 2 dogs but renters could not have dogs. I sent a message relaying that renters could not have dogs per HOA rules and they’d advertised 4 dogs (no weight limit) and we’d been sold an illegal rental.

A short time later, my phone rang and a man said, “you can stay, just tell them you have a service dog”! I went through

the roof...we’ve owned beach and ski property and honesty is important. Late afternoon, we got a message to call immediately, the townhouse was no longer dog friendly and we had to leave.

They gave us the option of 20 other properties and EVERYONE was either a studio or a 1 bedroom — NONE had a kitchen and every dog weight limit was 20-40 pounds! OR we could get a full refund.

We stayed one more night with their permission (they told us the charge would be \$77.00 for the first night and \$62.00 for the second night - very fair). We left at 5:30 am - we were in VA when we got an emailed invoice for \$1250 for our 2 night stay and eviction! We’d already paid \$3800 for the first installment of our 7 week stay.

The financial battle began and I got credit but all except \$500+. FINALLY last week, we walked with about a \$52.00 credit and a \$500 gift certificate from airbnb. We will use the gift certificate but we will never use airbnb again!

We have several on our road of 18 homes - the renters are fine but a couple of owners are irresponsible - one had a bear that got into his garbage last fall and it was there for 3.5 weeks - there were no means of enforcement. I don’t think our story is typical but if I want to gamble in the future, it will be in Vegas!

# When the going gets tough...

**New York State Comptroller Thomas P. DiNapoli** issued a surprisingly frank press release. Citing newly available data, he said, "The classroom disruptions caused by the pandemic have hurt New York's students. Academic losses were greater for younger students, with fourth grade scores dropping more than the national average," Mr. DiNapoli said. "...Recent data from The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) shows student performance dropped significantly in 2022 from 2019. New York's average score remained steady for eighth grade reading but declined in eighth grade math (down 6 points). Over this time, New York's losses in fourth grade math and reading scores were double the national average and exceeded 45 other states in math and 38 other states in reading. The average drop for fourth grade math scores (10 points) was so severe that McKinsey & Company estimated this learning loss to be the equivalent of nearly an entire school year." Beyond sobering, it was alarming. New York State responded quickly



— and in a way we might have expected, sadly. "NYS changes minimum scores for student proficiency in math, English," headlined the March 16 *Times-Union*. The first paragraph in reporter Kathleen Moore's story said, "New York will change what it takes for students to reach 'proficiency' on state math and English language arts tests, calling last year's lower scores the 'new normal.'" The *TU* story noted, "Last year some schools posted shocking results — in Schenectady, no eighth grader who took the math test scored as proficient." Maybe under the new lower standards, "proficient" will abound.

# Lois Askew at 100, oh the life she has lived, stories she tells

to go to in my community. I didn't like that school.

"I had a friend in the school district that I wanted to go and I had to walk to school two-and-a-half miles.

"I didn't have money to ride the bus.

The bus didn't cost but a nickel but if I had a dime to ride the bus, I bought candy.

"I would walk to school through a white community. See, we had seg-regation. We had black communities and white commu-nities. I had to walk through the white community to get to my black school over here."

How was that? I asked, assuming bad. "Nobody bothered me," said Elaine.

What did her parents think? "They didn't care. I did whatever I wanted to do."

### Lois's remarkable parents

Elaine shows a photo of the parents. Lois says, "She was a wo-man!, my mother was. Don't you mess with Miss Ada, Miss Ada'll shoot you..."

"Oh she was a wo-man! She could do anything. She could shoot a pistol, a gun, and she could work in the field. She could sew. I'd say, can you make this dress for me? She'd say, show me pictures. She could make it. She was a wo-man!"

And her father, Charles Octavius Whaley, "he was a man" — remarkably so.

When the photo of Lois's parents is displayed, no mention is made of race, but looking at Mr. Whaley I eventually had to ask, "Was he white?"

"He was a very proud black man," his granddaughter Elaine replied. "His father was black, his mother was white."

Her cousin Mary Ramsey Austin, also sharing knowledge at the kitchen table during *The Chronicle* interview, said Charles's parents were "mulatto," adding, "now we say multi-racial."

That further sparked Lois's memory.

"He would walk me to school and some-body called me, 'Girl, come here.' I said, 'Yes, ma'am.' She said, 'You stop here and let the white man pass.' I said, 'That ain't no white man. That's my daddy.'"

In Montgomery, where they moved from the farm to advance the kids' edu-cation, said Elaine, he worked in con-struction.

"Papa's time-card said white, but he was black. He went for black," Lois said.

Elaine says, "He was getting more pay than the black workers were. He had them change his time card" to identify him as black.

"They were a very well respected fam-ily," Elaine adds. "Look at the pictures."

Lois says, "We lived in a nice communi-ty. We could walk downtown, had a beau-tiful downtown. We had all the stores."

She recalls "roller skating on the main highways. We always had to have skates for Christmas. We come down that hill and you don't get in nobody's way 'cause you'd get knocked over. It reminds me of Glen Street, going down that hill."

Lois graduated from Booker T. Wash-ington High School in 1941, writes Elaine,

and "attended Alabama State Teachers College and Alabama State University for 2 years. Her first experience as a teacher was at Dozier Elementary School in Dozier, Alabama as a First and Second Grade Teacher."

### The Glens Falls-Woodbine connection

In the summer, Lois first came to Glens Falls. "People from the South would come to Lake George to work," she said.

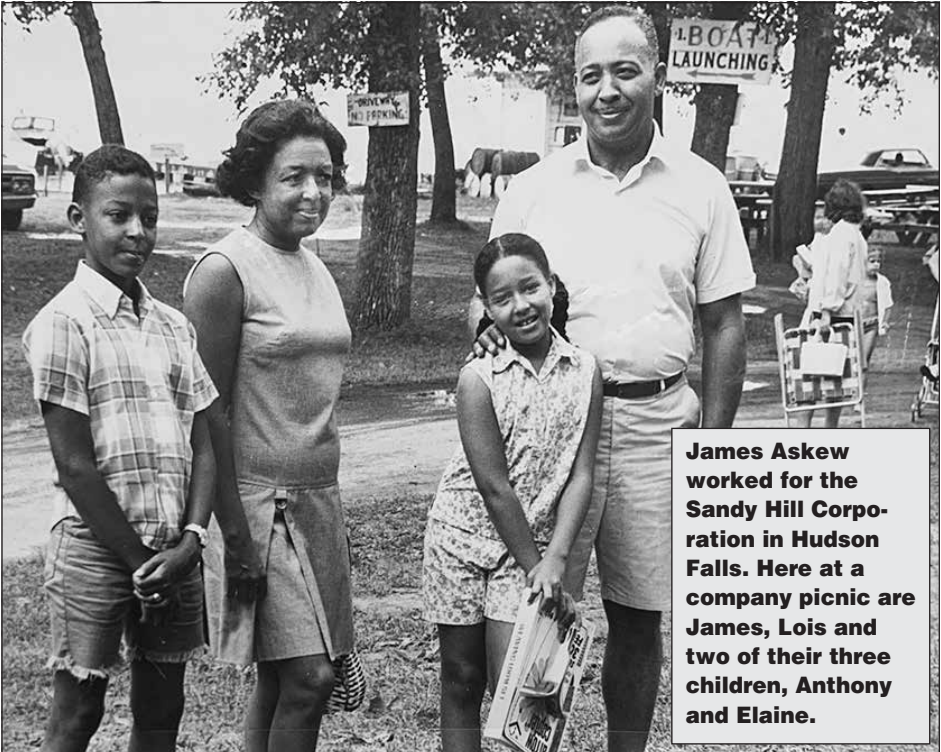
Lois worked at the Woodbine Restau-rant, Bar & Cottages in Lake George, owned by Samuel and Dorothy McPerson.

Elaine says Samuel was known as Mr. Mac or Pink. Cousin Mary [Mary's mother was the sister of Elaine's mother] said the McPersons also operated a hotel and res-taurant, known as Elmore's — Samuel's brother — on Glen Street in Glens Falls and later on Oakland Avenue.

The Woodbine was listed in the "Negro Motorist Green Book" that the History Channel says for three decades "provided African Americans with advice on safe places to eat and sleep when they traveled through the Jim Crow-era United States."

How did Lois know about the Wood-bine? Mary said the McPersons came

from the same town in Alabama that her family, the Whaleys, were from.

World War II transformed Lois's life.

Initially, Elaine writes, Lois "moved back to Montgomery," started "working at a downtown USO Club (for Coloreds)."

Lois recalls, "The guys from Tuskegee would come down to be with us women. You could come and relax and meet women and have a good time."

One serviceman was "U.S. Army Air Corps Soldier James Caswell Askew. He was stationed at Maxwell Field Base," Elaine writes.

Was it love at first sight? "Oh yeah, I think," Lois replies. "He was beautiful."

James served in the Army Air Corps, in New Guinea in the South Pacific.

He kept in touch with Lois by mail. "He detailed every letter," with his Pacific atmospheric drawings on the envelope.

Meanwhile, writes Elaine, "To support the war effort, [Lois] moved back to Glens Falls and worked at General Electric."

"I worked at the GE in Fort Edward," Lois says. "I did whatever they needed to be done. I would do anything."

On April 15, 1947, James and Lois married in Montgomery, visited James's home area of Ahsoskie, North Carolina, lived for a time in the Bronx, then chose to settle in Glens Falls in 1948.

**Their Broad Street home, 70 years**

Lois and James "raised 3 children: James Anthony Askew, John Charles Askew and Lois Elaine Askew at 28 Broad Street where she still resides."

St. Alphonsus Church stood directly across the street. Elaine notes, the priest "was very supportive of a black family moving into this neighborhood."

The house itself? Not so inviting. "When I first came in here, I couldn't go no further than here," says Lois. "Oh, the smell. It was a nursing home and the city had condemned it."

James turned it into the family's home of 70-plus years. He passed away at the age of 88 in 2008. He and Lois were married 60 years.

He was also responsible for a key aspect of the decor. Lois says, "My husband said to me one day, 'You get all these pictures and you stick 'em in a book and nobody can see 'em. So I started stickin' 'em on the refrigerator.' Now they're there, on the walls, on tables, and everywhere."

Lois continued her education at Skidmore College. "My occupation was a school teacher," she says. "I taught English literature."

She was involved early in the Prospect School with founder Marilyn Cohen and Heidi Cole. "That's the job she retired from," says Elaine.

She notes that her mom also worked "in the lunch room at St. Alphonsus" school across the street and "at Patrick's," the

vending business then around the corner.

Lois says, "We lived close enough that I could walk downtown," and recalls working at the Lerner Shop, where she was a window dresser, Elaine said.

James worked at the Queensbury Hotel and then Sandy Hill, the paper machinery maker in Hudson Falls, for 20 years as special assistant to chairman J. Walter Juckett.

The day before Lois's 100th birthday this Saturday will be the first birthday of her first great-grandchild, Caswell Taylor

Schroeder, son of granddaughter Samantha and Gerald Schroeder of Hartford in Washington County.

Samantha is the daughter of Elaine and her husband Rev. Leonard A. Oates.

Lois's two other grandchildren are Alycia Victoria Askew and Jonathan James Askew, children of her son John and daughter-in-law Vicki.

Elaine's biographical synopsis of Lois's life adds that her involvement in the "Glens Falls community for over 75 years" includes "supporting The First Baptist Church (over 50 years), NAACP, PTA of Broad Street School, Red Hat, Home Bureau, Senior Center Dancers."

"She continually enjoys the Word of God at Faith Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church, reading, crocheting blankets, snacking...snacking...snacking... visiting with friends and enjoying her growing family."

Speaking of snacking, Lois offered this reporter a Coca-Cola multiple times.

And a final note about the candy that Lois as a child preferred to spend her money on instead of on bus fare, she bought "chocolate with coconut because nobody would eat coconut and I didn't want to give anybody any of my candy."

Warren County: Get colorectal screening

To the Editor:

It seems a decade ago for some or just yesterday for others when COVID-19 upended our world. During that time many people put on hold regular health screenings including those that help catch certain cancers early.

March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness month and good time to get screened for colorectal cancer if you are between the ages of 45 and 75.

Talking about colorectal cancer screening can make some people uncomfortable but think about how

uncomfortable cancer is. Screening for colorectal cancer has come a long way and can even be done at home. Even better, if caught early colon cancer can be prevented by removing precancerous polyps.

Fecal Immunochemical Test (FIT), FIT-DNA test or Fecal Occult Blood Test (FOBT) are tests done at home and you send stool samples to a doctor's office or lab. Based on the results you may be asked to follow-up with your doctor or schedule a colonoscopy.

If you are worried about the costs for colorectal cancer screening there is a program locally that can help. The Cancer Services Program of Warren, Washington & Hamilton Counties at Glens

Falls Hospital helps women and men who live in New York State who meet program rules for age and income and do not have health insurance or have health insurance with a cost share that makes the cost of screening too high get screened.

Finally, people often say I don't have time to get screened. Think of it this way, the few hours it takes to get screened for colorectal cancer could give thousands of cancer-free hours to do those things you don't have time for.

No more excuses. Talk with your family and your doctor about getting screened for colorectal cancer today.

in high school, and I was just baking to bake.” Then, “I noticed I was pretty decent at it.”

She posted pictures of her creations on social media “just for fun. And then people would ask me to make cakes and cupcakes for them, and then they just kept asking, so I just kept doing it.”

She said she didn’t even post items for sale, people approached her with orders directly. They turned into repeat customers. Now, Flour Child has over 2,700 Facebook followers.

Taylor said since opening, they’re frequently sold out. She said Glens Falls has welcomed her wholeheartedly.

Her popular items are cakes and cupcakes, and what she calls “curse cookies” — cookies with curse words written in icing — and macaroons.

Taylor said she is learning on the fly. “I’m self taught” on making cakes. “I didn’t go to school for it or anything. I just YouTube, Pinterest, all sorts of things, just kind of doing it.”

“When I started, it’s funny because I would use box mix and box frosting. And I would just do one layer.”

Now, her cakes are multi-layered and textured — covered with designs like flowers and mushrooms.

She said she’s also learning the “back end,” bookkeeping, taxes and paperwork herself too. “Learn it as you go,” she said.

Taylor initially got ahead of herself. She said that when she was 19, she sought an available storefront on Phila Street in Saratoga Springs.

She put together a business plan — but “they didn’t want to rent to me. They pretty much looked at me like a 19, 20 year old girl. They were like yeah, no.”

Now, “I am so thankful that that didn’t

happen.”  
“It set me down for a while. It was a big kick in the face,” she said. “You need that sometimes. Like, I had to be knocked down. I was 19. I was not ready.”  
She spent the past few years working different jobs so she could keep baking.

Taylor said she worked several years as a mail carrier starting at age 18.  
“And then I left the Post Office so I could bake more — because I was working like seven days a week,” she said.  
“Then I worked at Umicore [the electrical materials business on Pruyn’s Island] because my hours were 6 a.m. to 2:30 [p.m.], so I could bake more.”  
At Umicore, “I don’t even know how to

explain it. It was like millwork! I literally put on my Carhartt pants and work boots and went to work,” she laughed.  
“Just so I could get out and bake. I did what I could to have good hours.”  
She said she got weekends off and, crucially, “an 11-day break at the holidays.”  
“Holidays are the busiest time of the year for bakers. I had that full stretch to do whatever,” says Taylor.  
“My whole world revolved around baking before anything else, really.”  
Last August her friend Ashley Kopf, owner of Abby’s Cookie Jar, approached her and said she was “looking to get out.”  
Taylor said she bought the business and all the assets in the space, and kept several staff members on.  
Things have taken off quickly.  
“We do have to turn custom orders away,” says Taylor. “We are very busy.”  
Plus, “The girls are slowly learning decorating, but I’m the only decorator.”  
Has she ever trained others to do what she does before? “No. It’s tough sometimes,” Taylor admits. “I’ve learned a lot of patience. I know we’ve only been here for six weeks, but it definitely teaches a

lot of patience and at the end of day it’s just cake. It’s just cooking.”  
“What’s the worst that’s going to happen, you have to rebake it?” she laughed.  
Flour Child has big ambitions. “I would like to be able to do so much more. And we’re looking to be part of events.”  
Their first will be the Glens Falls Brew Fest on Saturday, April 1, from 4 to 7 p.m. across the street at Cool Insuring Arena.

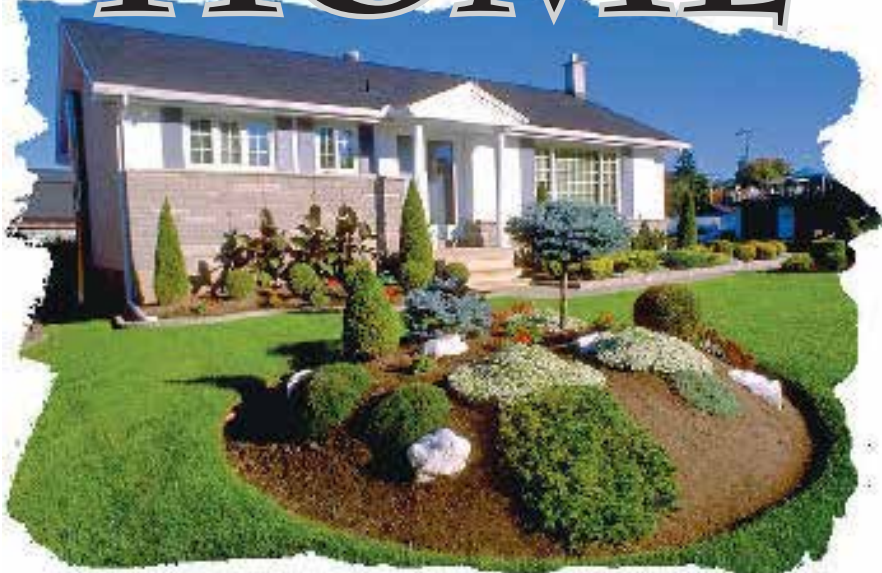

## LG grad Brittany Townsend builds new biz around rise of AirBnBs

new short term luxury rental units above Rude Betty on Glen Street, in the former Tyrer Auctions building that Tom Elliot purchased and finished renovating. The project is a “wow,” and so is Ms. Townsend, we noted.

“Brittany has such good energy. She’s an entrepreneur,” Mr. Elliot agreed.

“Tom is my ideal client,” says Ms. Townsend. “He’s a professional, making luxury accommodations; we are here to help with the guest experience.”

How they connected: “My best friend is Tom’s partner,” Ms. Townsend explains. “We grew up together in Lake George. Tom needed someone to run the properties, and my friend recommended me.”

She describes Calendula as “a professional co-host service.

“It’s not just cleaning between guests. It’s concierge services. We can make recommendations for activities, dining, make reservations for people.”

“We manage 12 properties fully and provide turnover services to another 30 or so,” she said.

“My standard operating procedure is to give homeowners a peace of mind. You know the place is good. I have a checklist for when my people are done cleaning. It’s very thorough.

“It’s not like a hotel. It’s a home. You can’t be there and someone lifts the cushion and there’s popcorn in the couch. My crew has to sign off on every room, and send a video of the place when it’s done.”

She says, “I work with AirBnB and all the platforms. I can manage the listings for owners, do the descriptions, run all the guest experience stuff.”

She’ll also work with the owner to equip, decorate and stage the rental unit.

She points to some signature amenities — the way they fan-fold hand towels in the bathroom; how each guest receives a miniature Victorian key as a welcome gift.

Besides that, she says, “we are building our own direct booking website. AirBnB and the other ones, they’re great platforms, but the homeowner doesn’t have any control over the guest experience.”

She’s got a different idea, she says. For example, Mr. Elliot has a property in Argyle with several out-buildings — a multi-bedroom house, a small cottage, and a unique little cabin that serves as the communal kitchen and as living space for three restored Airstreams arrayed around it as bedrooms.

“I can offer a whole experience for the group, with yoga classes, Reiki. I have a network of healers I work with. We can bring in a chef to cook for them. Guests like the full boutique experience.”

“I have a lot of ideas,” Ms. Townsend laughs. “I take what I think should be done, I have someone build a system, and then we work out the kinks.”

“My crew is great,” she says. “Everyone is there for each other. She employs 8 people currently, up to 25 in the summer she said.

“I have key members, team leaders that keep an eye on everything, any conflicts. Even though I own the company, my job is to be part of the team too. I am significant, and they are as significant in the day to day operations.”

Are short term rentals good for the community? “Our rentals are enjoyed by families coming here to spend money in town, and go to some restaurants. We are providing hospitality to people who are visiting our town.”

Ms. Townsend says she started her current career “in the dealership business,” selling cars. “I’m a single mom of a six-year-old. I learned a lot about business systems, client follow-up.”

She didn’t like when a deal feel through over some thing like supply chain issues that were out of her control, she said.

“My mom has an AirBnB across the street from her. She was there all the time, cleaning and everything. It’s her retirement investment. I don’t want her to continue to have to do that. I started by cleaning that house for her, and I started my business in July of ’21.

“My mom is my co-parent. It’s the least I could do, to use the business I’m building to make her investment property better. She’s a stickler. I learned that from her.”

Ms. Townsend adds, “I grew up in Lake George. I worked at Capri Pizza for 20 years, and learned a lot. It’s a tourist town. I’m used to hosting people, networking with other business owners.”

She said she moved for several years to Estes Park, Colorado, but came home when she had her daughter to be closer to her family.

Ms. Townsend is also proudly in recovery, and says she aims to be “inclusive,” encouraging others also in the recovery community who are looking for opportunities to work.

She named her company Calendula after the herbal flower, she said. “It’s an antioxidant, anti-inflammatory, with healing properties.”

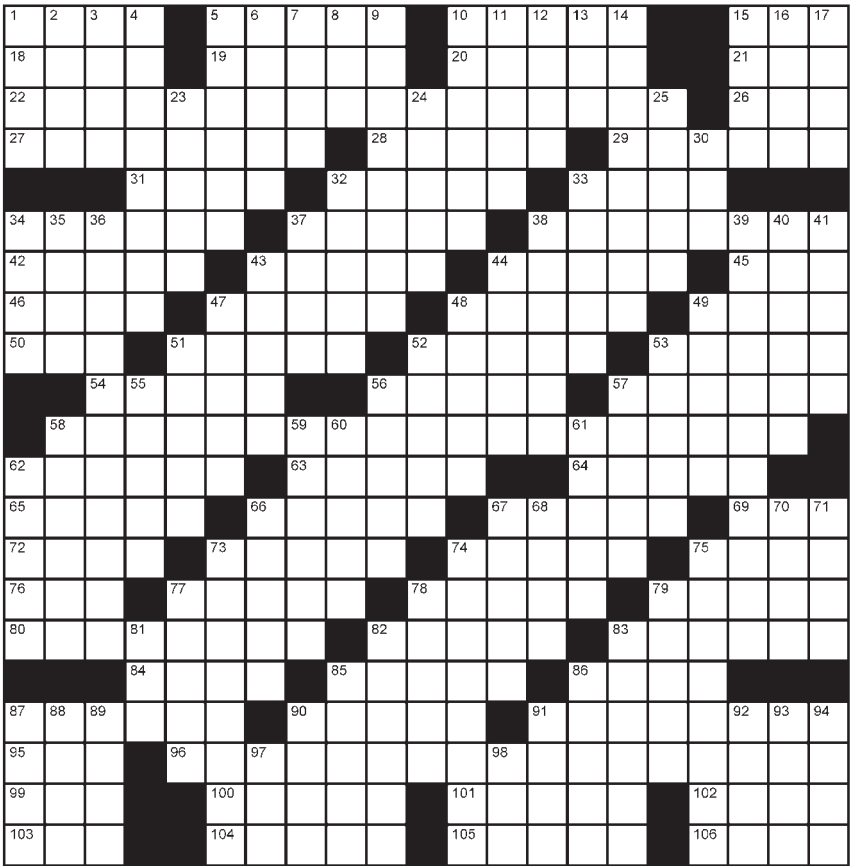

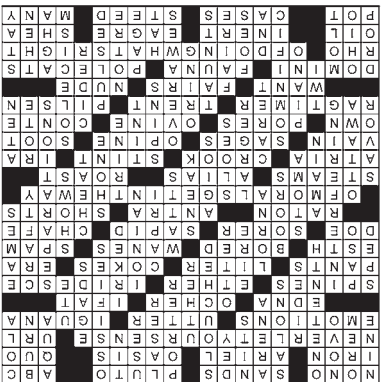

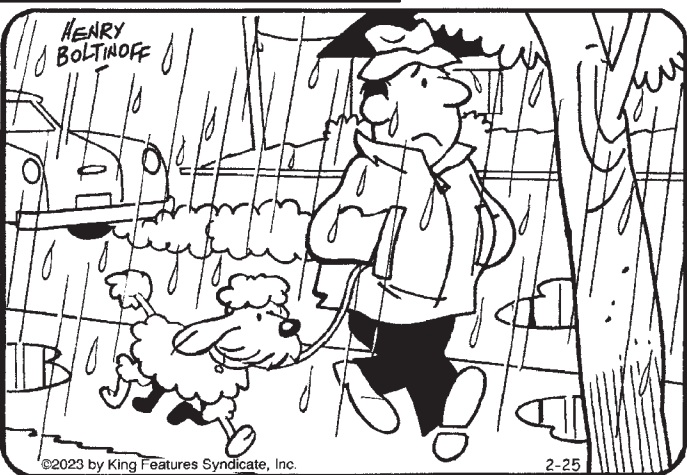
