Glens Falls has restored its namesake statue.


"The Shepherd was here when we got here, kept a watchful eye on us. It's kind of the signature of our church," said Dixon Ballard, a church council member who has attended it since 1972.

"I was involved in helping the restoration in '85," he said. Nearly 40 years

later, Mr. Ballard said the statue was getting into a "pretty serious state of disrepair....I kind of piped up because I knew it was a little more involved than just a paint job. Come to find out it was quite a bit more in involved."

'I agree with your scoop; expect haters on left to go crazy'


Wow. Mark:
