West Mountain makes its move

At its March 26 meeting, the Queensbury Planning Board voted to acknowledge receipt of an application that, if it comes to fruition, would transform the West Mountain ski area.

The Woods at West Mountain, which has a 10-year time frame to complete, looks to create "an alpine village experience" with year-round recreational activities, accommodations for vacationers and expectation to attract "permanent residents" who may desire to live in a resort/recreational community, including locals looking to downsize."

The plan calls for 252 apartment units, 64 condominium units, 56 duplex units, 65 single-family custom homes and an 80-room hotel. Envisioned is a new retail plaza with a new main ski lodge and outdoor seasonal dining and sitting areas adjacent to a man-made water feature.

A high-speed detachable chair lift is proposed to transport skiers from the Alpine Village to the summit of Northwest Mountain.

An outdoor Après Ski Plaza area with swimming pool, ice skating rink and hot tubs is proposed for use by the apartment and condominium residents. The duplexes and

Solar eclipse 4/8 rare 'totality'; County: Prepare for heavy traffic

A solar eclipse — where the moon passes in front of the sun — will cross New York State on Monday afternoon, April 8.

Portions of the Adirondacks will be in the path of "The Totality" causing darkness for more than 3 minutes between 3 and 3:30 p.m.

"The temperature drops. Insects and birds are singing and then it's total silence. Animal behavior changes. It feels like dusk," Scientist Mindy Townsend told a Crandall Library crowd last fall.

Effects will be slightly less dramatic, with 88 to 99 percent coverage in the Glens Falls area and Capital Region beginning around 2 p.m.

North River gets 'totality'

"Warren County residents are asked to prepare for **heavy traffic, possible cell phone service disruptions and other potential impacts...**," wrote county Director of Public Affairs Don Lehman.

Here is text from the press release: Northwestern Warren County is among the areas of Upstate New York that will experience a total solar eclipse the afternoon of Monday, April 8. The hamlet of **North River and adjacent areas are expected to see a total blackout** for over one minute **around 3:25 p.m.**

The remainder of Warren County will see a partial eclipse, with near darkness. Points to the north in the Adirondacks will see a total eclipse, which means **traffic on Warren County roads will be heavy heading north beforehand and south afterward** should weather conditions be optimal.

Warren County **Office of Emergency Services** recommends:

Local residents try to **avoid traveling in the hours immediately before and after the eclipse**, as heavy traffic is expected when people from outside of the region return home.

NY State leaders are forecasting **possible gridlock on major roads**, with local impacts seen on the Northway/I-87, Route 9, Route 28, Route 149 & Route 8.

Those who are travelling **bring food and water, charge their cellphones and fuel their vehicles** before setting out, in case they get stuck in traffic or fuel stations experience supply issues.

Those wishing to **view the eclipse find a spot off of a road** and refrain from viewing from a roadside.

Those who come to Warren County for the eclipse are asked to plan to stay locally Monday night to reduce traffic immediately after the eclipse.

Individuals planning to view the eclipse directly **have eclipse glasses** certified by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 12312-2 **to avoid eye damage.**

Office staff have [met] to formulate plans for emergency response if needed.

Warren County Administrator John Taflan said: "We are excited to welcome

visitors to Warren County and the Adirondacks for this once-in-a-generation event. We anticipate large crowds coming to and passing through Warren County

from other areas to view this eclipse, so we ask that residents and visitors prepare for heavy traffic and possible service disruptions."

Bonacio projects 'all green light'; GF must fulfill contract to give it free parking

"It's all green light," says Glens Falls Mayor Bill Collins, now that Governor Kathy Hochul approved \$6.6-million in Home and Community Renewal tax credits for Phase Two of developer Sonny Bonacio's Spring City projects on South and Elm Streets. It also activates Phase One.

"I think they're full speed ahead. We believe that Phase One should break ground in June," said the mayor.

Phase One includes purchase and renovation of the former Hotshots building on South Street and the so-called Incubator building on Elm Street (both owned by the Glens Falls Local Development Corporation), as well as renovation of the former Sandy's Clam Bar that Bonacio Development purchased separately.

"They want to be all done with this by the late fall," Mayor Collins said, "to match up" with the Market Center now under construction adjacent to the incubator building.

Phase Two, Bonacio's 70-unit apartment and mixed use complex, "should break ground by the fall or the end of the year," the Mayor said.

He said he aims to have a public meeting about the project later this month, likely on a Wednesday or Thursday, April 18-19 or 25-26.

City must give 110 parking spaces

In its contract with Spring City/Bonacio, the City of Glens Falls committed to provide 110 parking spaces for the two projects, 35 for the Phase One renovations and 75 for Phase Two apartments/mixed use, at no charge to Bonacio.

A plan fell through to erect a garage on adjacent land owned by Glens Falls National Bank.

Mayor Collins says the city pledged, "If that doesn't work, we'll find you 110 spaces so that you can bring 100 apartments and 40 jobs to our downtown."

The mayor says the City "is talking with" the owners of 333 Glen Street to lease the spaces in its parking garage, and, he said, possibly "to work on a public private partnership to add two floors" to the garage, which he said it is built for.

Mr. Flagg pointed to \$1.5 million in additional state money to fund a parking structure downtown that was promised in 2018 "and still available."

He and the mayor said adding two levels to the 333 Glen garage will cost more than the \$1.5 million.

They did not have a figure but said, "It's cheaper than building a new building."

Mayor Collins said, "We have other options," to provide the spaces — including

- the Elm Street surface parking lot;
- the privately owned parking garage on Clinton Street next to The Mill, where the city owns 50 spaces it currently leases "for next to nothing";
- the Park Street garage, which the City owns and which was also built to accommodate two more floors.

"But right now I'm trying to work with 333 Glen Street," Mayor Collins said.

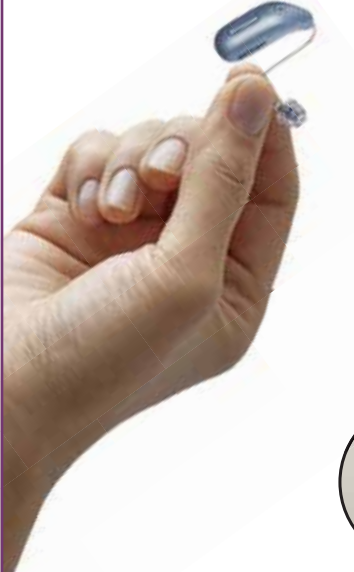

TU: 2 vaccines being tried vs. Lyme disease

“Two vaccines show promising early results” combating Lyme disease, headlined an article by Roger Hannigan Gilson in the March 24 Albany Times-Union.

“Humans develop Lyme from Borrelia burgdorferi, a bacterium they may acquire after being bitten by an infected black-legged tick (more often called the “deer tick”). But ticks are merely the intermediary between mice and humans — they get the bacteria after biting white-footed mice,” Mr. Gilson wrote.

He said US Biologic, based in Memphis “wants to solve the epidemic not by vaccinating humans, but by vaccinating mice. Its vaccine is delivered via food pellets.”

“In May 2023, the company received a conditional license from the U.S. Department of Agriculture to distribute the pellets via pest-control companies after demonstrating its vaccine safely and uniquely addressed an emergency condition, according to the company. US Biologic is now moving toward full licensure,” its president said.

Meanwhile, says the TU article, “The French biotech company Valneva and the pharmaceutical company Pfizer have paired together to test out a Lyme vac-

cine for humans with the working name VLA15.” It said, citing a Pfizer news release, the vaccine “has demonstrated a strong immune response and satisfactory safety profile in pre-clinical and clinical studies so far.”

Man arrested after infant ingests cocaine

Lucas J. Smith, 24, of Salem, was charged by the Washington County Sheriff’s Office with first-degree reckless endangerment and other offenses after a 10-month-old child reportedly ingested cocaine at Mr. Smith’s residence.

The child is a patient in the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit at Albany Medical center, said the March 22 report.

Blake Walsh, boyfriend of Kaylin Gillis, sued Kevin Monahan and his wife Jinx Monahan for emotional distress.

In January, Kevin Monahan was convicted of second-degree murder after shooting and killing Gillis when she and a group of friends mistakenly turned into his driveway while on their way to a party. Walsh, the driver of Gillis’s car, is suing for an unspecified amount.

Ms. Gillis’s father previously filed a \$5 million lawsuit for wrongful death.

Jeremy Messina Assembly bid vs. Woerner

Jeremy Messina of Greenwich announced his candidacy for the 113th Assembly District seat held by Carrie Woerner since 2015.

Mr. Messina said he is a lifelong resident of Washington County and resides on his family’s farm in Greenwich with his wife and two daughters. He has served on the Greenwich and Washington County Republican Committees for eight years.

The press release said he “believes in limited, constitutional government and was raised on strong conservative principles.”

“It is extremely important to have a representative that will fight for our Upstate values in Albany and who will focus on making New York a better and more affordable place to live,” Mr. Messina was quoted.

Marcy hiker rescued, overnight search; clothes froze to skin

From DEC Forest Rangers reports:

On March 22 at 9:45 p.m., Ray Brook Dispatch received a call from a woman reporting her 33-year-old son from New York City was overdue from hiking Mount Marcy and Gray and Skylight mountains.

At 10:10 a.m. the following morning, rangers found the subject at 4,000 feet elevation, with his clothes frozen to his body. Fifteen rangers were involved in the search.

They used a patient care kit to change the hiker's wet clothing, feed him and provide warm liquids before walking him to the trailhead, where they were met by Lake Placid EMS at 3:25 p.m.

EMS took the subject to the hospital for treatment of hypothermia and frostbite.

Search details: "At 10:28 p.m., Forest Ranger Mecus located the subject's vehicle at Adirondak Loj.

"Rangers attempted to retrace the subject's itinerary, going up and over Mount Marcy and down to Four Corners.

"Due to the urgency of the snowstorm potentially hiding footprints or other clues to the hiker's location," 15 Rangers were sent out early the next morning

"At 8 a.m., Ranger Mecus' search crew located a single set of boot tracks near the Feldspar lean-to.

"The crew followed the tracks up the Lake Arnold trail to where the tracks lost the trail, on Opalescent Brook on the northwest face of Mount Marcy," eventually finding the subject at 4,000 feet.

Fort Ann's Tyler Mattison has Tommy John surgery

Tyler Mattison, 24, the Fort Ann native who is a top 30 Detroit Tigers' pitching prospect, underwent Tommy John surgery on March 15 and will miss the 2024 season. The now common elbow surgery requires at least a year's recuperation.

Mattison, picked by the Tigers in the fourth round of the 2021 draft, is their 28th ranked prospect.

The 6'4", 235 pound right-handed reliever went 5-1 with a 2.41 ERA while striking out 91 batters in 59.2 innings last year in 41 games with the High-A West Michigan Whitecaps and AA Erie SeaWolves.

NIH: All about acne

From the National Institutes of Health:

Acne is a common skin condition that causes pimples. These bumps usually arise on your face. Acne can also appear on your back, chest, or shoulders. Anyone can get acne. But it is most common in teens and young adults. For most people, acne goes away by about age 30.

Acne usually pops up when hair follicles under the skin become clogged with oil or other substances. This can lead to swelling and redness, or inflammation.

There are different types of acne, including whiteheads, which produce a white bump. Blackheads look black because air changes the color of oils in the clog. The color is not caused by dirt. Severe nodular acne, sometimes called cystic acne, can cause deep, painful, pus-filled bumps.

Acne can usually be treated with over-the-counter products that you put on the skin. For more severe acne, health care providers may suggest prescription treatments.

Great Escape Communications Manager Taylor Myers told *The Chronicle*,

"Given the age and space capabilities of the former Johnny Rockets building, we have decided to design a new space that better aligns with our property makeup for the exciting addition of Hurricane Grill & Wings."

"Hurricane Grill & Wings will bring a restaurant unlike anything in the area," Six Flags Great Escape Resort President Rebecca Wood was quoted in the release.

Gregg Nettleton, President and COO of Hurricane Grill & Wings, was quoted, "We are thrilled to be extending Hurricane's reach in New York with our first location in the upstate area. Six Flags is a great partner of our parent company, FAT Brands, and we see this as a next step in furthering the brand's growth from a non-traditional standpoint."

The menu also touts "Classic comfort starters, delicious fish tacos, juicy steak with chimichurri sauce, beer battered fish & chips, salad with seared ahi tuna and burgers with all the fixings" plus "kid's entrees, a full bar boasting 20 draft beer selections and tasty desserts."

Moreau enacts 9-month halt on industrial development; Biochar calls it 'targeted'

The Moreau Town Board voted unanimously on April 1 to adopt a nine-month moratorium on commercial and industrial development in its manufacturing and industrial zones. Councilman Kyle Noonan was not present to vote.

Saratoga Biochar Solutions attorney Charles Dumas called the move "targeted" against the company.

The moratorium prohibits permits or approvals in the zones until the town board can perform an updated review of its comprehensive plan.

It also prohibits issuing any permits allowing disposal or processing of any waste or waste material not originating within the boundaries of the town until the town can consider the proper application of Chapter 92 of the town code.

Saratoga Biochar attorney Mr. Dumas said at a March 28 public hearing on the moratorium, "It's hard for me to watch how the public opposition to this project has metastasized into this proceeding... There's been a lot of mischaracterizations and half truths put forth on social media... Saratoga Biochar Solutions has done everything according to the processes that were established..." He said the moratorium seeks "to pull the rug out" after it has made a "substantial investment."

also say that it's pretty nery, too, especially the assertion that "protecting Lake George is [the LGA's] responsibility."
I mean, it is the LGPC that is shelling out hundreds of thousands of dollars annually to hand harvest the Eurasian Watermilfoil that threatens Lake George's ecology and tourism economy. As best as I understand it, responsibility

usually lies where the buck stops. Being "testy" and nery is not the best way to address this important issue. LGPC Executive Director Dave Wick's invitation to engage in further discussions would seem to be the more helpful approach, especially if the discussions were informative beyond the noisy LGA vitriol.
For example, might the discussions better explain to the invested public the difference between selective, systemic herbicides such as ProcettaCOR and environmentally hazardous, non-selective, contact herbicides, particularly as regards the potential for risks to the lake's ecology? Isn't the selective, systemic herbicide treatment by definition particularized and localized, for example?
But Informative explanations are, at best, confused by the obvious conflict between the LGPC scientific studies and LGA denialism. The problem with LGA's denialism is that the only explanation that the LGA can offer for its denials is simply that there are too many unknowns. The LGA simply just doesn't know.
Not knowing something is no way to make important decisions, especially if you are the one with the "responsibility." And it certainly is no basis for being testy or nery in dealing with partners or companion agencies when it comes to preserving, protecting, and promoting the health and welfare of the Queen of American Lakes.

single-family homes would have ski-in/ski-out access to West's ski trails.

The duplex buildings would be equipped with two-car garages and driveways. The hotel would have dining and a banquet facility as well as an exercise and spa facility with hot tubs and indoor and outdoor swimming pools.

The existing Northwest Mountain Day-Use Lodge would be renovated "to upgrade its exterior finishes and visual character to complement other new structures in The Woods at West Mountain."

An outdoor amphitheater graded into the hillside is proposed west of the lodge.

Spencer Montgomery: A 'learning mountain' ideal for metro families; it's a huge opportunity but also key to survival

Spencer Montgomery, West Mountain's co-owner, emphasized the appeal the Woods at West Mountain development could have for families. "Look at the average family coming up from Long Island, New York City or Brooklyn," he said.

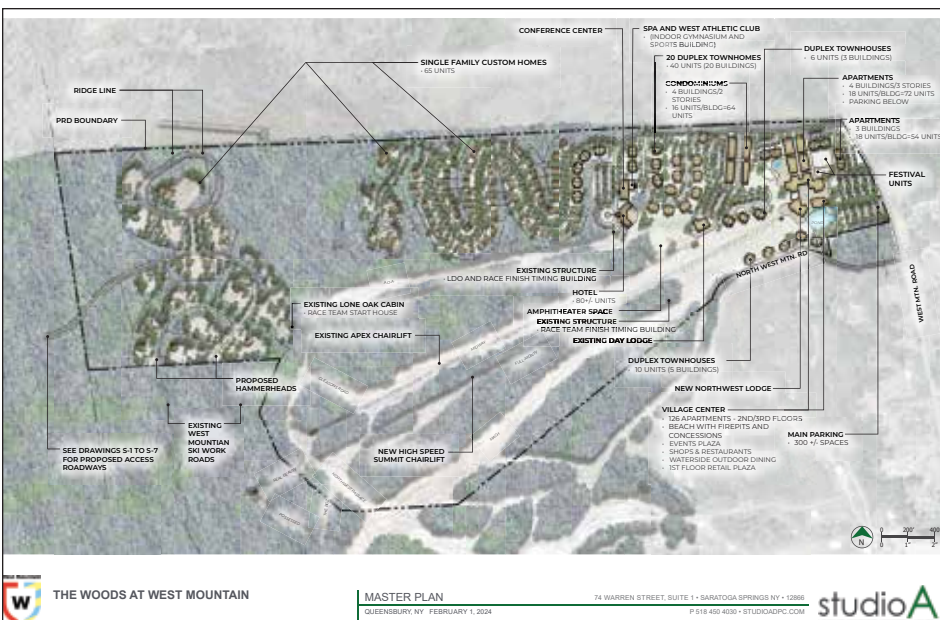

nario. You can go to the spa, steam room, you can go work out, you can ski, and we're open from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. so you've got a 13-hour babysitter for your kids."

He said, "We've been told that it's anticipated that this would sell out potentially

before it was built, because there's that type of demand."

Currently, he said, "Our reach is pretty limited because we're not viewed as a destination resort."

He said this year West Mountain will have an operating loss of around half a million dollars "just due to the weather."

He said the planned four-season resort "really is a necessity to ensure the future of West Mountain."

Jon Lapper, project legal counsel, said, "It's a **tough time to be a low-altitude ski mountain in climate change**, but **we think that this is going to put them on the map** more than it is."

Landscape architect: Capture I-87 skiers who veer east to VT

"When we say a destination resort we don't mean a destination ski area — it's planned as a destination four-season resort," Woods of West Mountain landscape architect **Jeff Anthony** told the Queensbury Planning Board.

Saratoga-based **Mr. Anthony** said **Holiday Valley Resort** in Ellicottville is the closest thing New York has to a destination resort. But that's 5 1/2 hours away, in western New York.

"Skiers come up I-87, and they get to Glens Falls and what do they do? They make that big right-hand turn and hop on that road that goes to the destination resorts in Vermont..."

"This is meant to replace that and attract those users to stay in this area."
