Washington County Sheriff's new simulator lets officers practice realistic gun situations

The Washington County Sheriff's Office has a new piece of technology that helps its officers train like never before.

The Multiple Interactive Learning Objectives Range Pro Interactive Force Simulator, acquired in February, can virtually put officers in thousands of scenarios they might encounter in their job, so they can practice reacting to situations. Some of the situations are very dangerous, like responding to an active shooter call. Others

are less intense, like talking to a driver who is being obstinate after getting pulled over by a cop. **"In a classroom setting, you can't**
